In March of 1972, I was ordained a transitional deacon at St. Meinrad Seminary and Archabbey during the second semester of my third year of Theological studies there. Since I would be ordained a priest the following year, the Diocese wanted to give me some parish pastoral experience before then, so I was assigned to spend the summer of 1972 with Fr. Tim Foley at Holy Rosary Parish in Fairmont City. I enjoyed my short time there, and still have fond memories of some of the wonderful people I met at Holy Rosary.

Our Diocese continues to assign our seminarians to spend their summer at a parish to familiarize them with parish life. This summer the Diocese has invited me to host a seminarian here, and I have gladly accepted that opportunity. His name is Nicholas Fleming, and he will begin his final year of seminary studies at Kenrick Seminary in St. Louis this Fall. Nick is scheduled to be ordained a transitional deacon by Bishop Braxton on June 8 at our Cathedral in Belleville. As a deacon, he will be able to baptize, preach and preside at weddings outside of Mass.

He will stay with me in my new home, and will participate in all facets of our parish life during these upcoming summer months! I wonder if he knows how to cook!!



Today's Gospel story is the powerful question of Jesus to Peter: "Do you love me?" Then Jesus charges him to "Feed my Sheep". This charge is given to each and every one of us. We are all called to tend to the flock in our Parish but also to those who are not among us. We must fulfill this through the living out our own vocation – single, married, religious or ordained. We must encourage and support each other to the max to live our callings. Prayerfully we ask for help to discern our call, perhaps even to the priesthood or religious life.

St. Philip (first century) was among John the Baptist's followers who saw John point out Jesus as the Lamb of God. He is most prominent in the Gospel of John. It was Philip who asked Jesus to "show us the Father, an we will be satisfied," to which Jesus replied, "Whoever has seen me has seen the Father" (John 14:8-9). Legends of Philip have him preaching in Greece, Phrygia, and Syria along with Bartholomew. He was crucified upside-down in AD 54. His feast day is May 3.

By being connected to what matters most to them, I think that helps build a connection between me and my students. What is your wish for your students as you see them graduate from ICS? That they live a life filled with faith, peace, and happiness. What have your students taught you as a teacher and a person? That every day is different and brings its own set of challenges. If we can get through today, we can get through tomorrow.
