Meet Rabbi Taylor Poslosky!

Rabbi Taylor Poslosky is thrilled to join Congregation Shalom as its new Assistant Rabbi centered in prayer, community, and Jewish tradition.

Rabbi Poslosky grew up in Overland Park, Kansas where she was very involved in the Reform Jewish community. She graduated from William Jewell College with her Bachelor of Arts in Religion. During her time as a Director of Youth Engagement in Scottsdale, Arizona, she pursued a certificate in Jewish Education for



Adolescents and Emerging Adults from Hebrew Union College-Jewish Institute of Religion (HUC-JIR). She received her Master's degree in Hebrew Letters and Rabbinic ordination in May of 2021 from HUC-JIR's Cincinnati campus.

Rabbi Poslosky served several Jewish communities as a student rabbi during her time at HUC-JIR ranging from congregations large and small to Hillel at a major university. Her fondest memories come from her time at The Valley Temple in Cincinnati. There, Rabbi Poslosky formed deep relationships with congregants through compassionate care and joyful Jewish experiences. These characteristics carried over to her Clinical Pastoral Education (CPE) work where she provided pastoral care at several area hospitals and Arden Courts memory care facility, in addition to leading services and Jewish learning sessions at The Seasons retirement community.

Rabbi Poslosky felt so drawn to the work that she completed two units of CPE at HUC-JIR. Pastoral work is at the heart of her rabbinate. She feels God's presence in the moments of deep connection with other people. Much of Judaism revolves around the telling of our shared stories, so there is something Jewish and sacred in the listening and sharing of our own stories.

Temple youth group and Jewish summer camp are integral pieces of Rabbi Poslosky's Jewish identity that have shaped not only her style as a Jewish educator, but her overall nature. She believes that our youth are the future of our movement and cannot wait to get to know the children of Congregation Shalom.

Rabbi Poslosky loves reading, watching the Kansas City Chiefs and Royals, and, most recently the Milwaukee Bucks. Fear the Deer! She has a healthy obsession with all things ice cream and custard, and she would love to meet with you for coffee or custard soon!

Shalom Dayenu Circle

A Jewish voice has been added to the cry for climate justice. "Dayenu" (dayenu.org) was founded a year ago to express outrage about the increasing



destruction of the natural world and to take bold actions towards restoring clean air, water and untainted land.

The name of this movement was taken from the Hebrew word, "Dayenu". Dayenu means "enough", and was chosen to express the dual sentiment, "we *have* enough (resources from the planet) and also "we *have* had enough (exploitation of the earth).

Congregation Shalom's Dayenu Circle will work with the national office and with other circles. Our Circle will also act autonomously. We will select our own projects. These will be action-oriented-with goals that are achievable, collaborative and even audacious. Here's what you can do right now:

Join one of Shalom Dayenu Circle's Teams and let's get to work:

- Team "Tikkun Olam" will look at global and national issues in which we can get involved
- Team "Ha Ir" will look at community and local issues. We will partner
 and support organizations doing work in environmental justice and
 team up with other synagogues, Jewish and interfaith organizations
 to act together.
- Team "Hillel" will explore personal actions undertaken by many of us, whether it be related to solar, composting and when acted upon cumulatively, will make a difference. Arlington, VA-based Temple Rodef is utilizing a great interactive resource called drawdownecochallenge.org which we intend to adapt here at Shalom.
