

"SMALL GROUP" MINISTRY

Have you heard that phrase being thrown around Westminster lately? I've been tossing it out at meetings, in conversations at coffee hour and whenever I get the chance to bring it up.

What does the group look like? It is composed of 5-10 people who meet twice a month. Each leader is provided with a structure for the meeting. It would look something like this: Begin with a ritual, such as lighting a candle, open with a devotional, there is a time to check in to share what is going on in your life, and then a discussion topic would be introduced, each member has the chance to talk about what the topic means, how it impacts and creates questions for them personally. This occurs without interruption. The other members of the group listen deeply. They come together, not to fix or solve problems, but to support and encourage. And each person has the opportunity to share in this way. We hold space for each other. Maybe you share a meal before or after, or have coffee and cookies. Really, it's a place where we can really get to know a few members in the congregation very well.

Small group ministry helps churches strengthen and deepen trust, friendship and connection to the larger

church body. It is also a fabulous way for new members to meet others, and seasoned members to extend their network and meet outside worship in a relaxed way.

So I invite you to consider what small group ministry might mean for you. Notice the questions that arise, what thoughts come up for you about this ministry. Does it speak to you in some way? I would love to hear about them and the other Small Group Ministry Planning Committee would love to hear about them, too.

Please feel free to share your comments and questions with any of us! We anticipate the rollout of Small Groups this Fall.

Pastor's Pen . . .

SABBATICAL IN 2016

I read in Wikipedia that sabbatical means, "a period of paid leave granted for study or travel" to university faculty, usually after 7 years. And an "archaic" understanding of the word says it is "of or appropriate to the Sabbath".

Both of these uses make sense of my upcoming sabbatical. When we renewed my "call agreement" to pastor Westminster UCC in 2013, it included the contractual obligation of providing me with a sabbatical. Beginning on May 24th, I will remove myself from active ministry at Westminster for "a period of paid leave granted for study or travel" until August 16th. I won't be going out of the country, but there will certainly be some travel opportunities, this summer. I will also take advantage of this time to do some studying of issues of particular interest to me.

But I understand this upcoming sabbatical in the archaic use of the word also: I plan to take Sabbath time, this summer, while I am away from my rich and engaging work with all of you. Sabbath time will be resting my body and my mind; giving me respite from the busyness of ministry and helping me to embrace

and appreciate the richness of God's loving gifts in my life and in this world!

During this 12-week period of rest and renewal, (and of digging in my vegetable beds!), Pastor Jan will lead a team of volunteers, and the staff, in ongoing support of the Westminster faith community. She will be the 20-hour a week paid staff member to assist you in pastoral need, in worship and prayer (and in media of course!). Pastor Jan will be in class at the beginning of my sabbatical so you can expect additional clergy support then (June 5-12). She will also be going on a brief summer vacation (July 12-19). Pastor Linda Crowe (retired) and Pastor Lew Hinshaw (retired) will provide pastoral care, and lead in worship, when Pastor Jan is unavailable. Our Moderator, Jenn Marquis, and chair of Personnel, Roger Stephens, as well as other key church leaders will be on hand to assist.

I want to thank you, the people of Westminster, for the blessing of sabbatical. I appreciate you, and I appreciate this opportunity.

Environmental Justice Workshop

N-Sid-Sen Camp & Retreat Center March 9-11, 2016

How can people of faith work for environmental justice for all? How can we create a sustainable, healthy, and inclusive community? This "train the trainer" workshop will explore these questions to empower conversation and actions around environmental justice far beyond the workshop.

In initial sessions, participants explore themes of a faith-based approach to environmental justice: gratitude, humility, responsibility, justice and community. Each theme includes biblical readings, selections from the video Renewal, insights from respected leaders, and additional study questions. We will be looking at Water Management practices in both urban and rural settings, possibly including a field trip by boat. Remaining time will focus on responses to environmental challenges:

Working through issues of environmental despair to build communities based on hope; Developing strategies and activities for participants' local communities; Creating a plan for participants' own workshops in their home communities.

Each participant will be given tools to carry out these activities.

This workshop is co-sponsored by the Pacific Northwest Conference of the United Church of Christ and UCC Justice and Witness Ministries.

Prayer continues with a Vigil of prayer, readings, silence, songs and conversation between 6:30 pm-12:00 midnight. The 8 scenes of Christ's passion will be available for meditative prayer through the day and the night.

Easter Morning: 9:00 am Potluck Celebratory Brunch. 10:30 am Joyous Worship on this Resurrection Day! Baptism. Singing. Bells. Celebrating. Praying. Preaching. Alleluia's all Together with a Cross of Flowers!

Felsőrákos Celebration

On Sunday, April 3, we will celebrate our association with the church in Felsőrákos, Romania. There is only one church in Felsőrákos and it is Unitarian. Its pastor, Joszef Kotecz, visited our church in 2013. The village has about 900 people living in it and they all speak Hungarian.






