
Indonesian Shadow Puppets and Their American Counterparts

This presentation deals with a visiting Indonesian scholar-in-residence who brought to the classroom issues of culture, history, politics, religion, and the arts which resulted in the creation of contemporary shadow puppets.

Wayang Kulit is a unique form of theatre employing light and shadow and is one of the oldest traditions of storytelling in the world. The puppets are crafted from buffalo hide and mounted on bamboo sticks. When held up behind a piece of white cloth, with an electric bulb or an oil lamp as the light source, shadows are cast on the screen. The puppets are beautiful art objects focusing on:

Descriptive Contours

Negative Space
Repeated Patterns
Asymmetry and Symmetry
Finished front and back




The Dalang tells the story, manipulates all the figures, interprets characters and voices for each, and produces sound effects. The Dalang also sings, cues the musical accompaniment, speaks several languages and blesses the performances.

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



Fasteners were used to allow motion at the shoulders and elbows. Sticks weren't glued on they were sewed on to allow a greater range of motion.











Some students chose a more traditional puppet style.





Some students chose to keep their puppets closer to the original story.








Colored acetates, gels, and cellophane were used to add color when projected.








An English classroom was converted into a theater.

Advanced Topics in Studio Art Stretching the Curriculum





This puppet was exhibited at a local museum as part of their Emerging Artists exhibition.

The Advanced Topics in Studio Art program allows students to find their own style and "voice," emphasizes thinking for themselves and taking risks, and pondering aesthetics. They must embrace the quotation, "There is no such thing as a mistake, there is only a change of direction.



The Advanced Topics in Studio Art class had to create a self-portrait/figurative puppet, with moving parts, that reflected some aspect of their personality and/or mood. They could use any materials and any style they wanted to.











The original self-portrait project was entitled "Illustrating a Headache." But was changed to Leonardo da Vinci's "Motions of the Mind" when the creator of the above puppet mentioned she never got headaches.

The student who created this puppet focused on her love: Fashion!




Revolving Eye Puppet

This puppet reflects two different moods of the maker.











Exploring new materials was encouraged Colored acetates were used to give this image an eerie quality.









Here are a few examples of what the lesson looked like before it morphed into the Shadow Puppet assignment.






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








The comprehensive skills students (autistic students) did a modified version of the shadow puppet— the sparkling results were based on their names!
