Cathedral of Saint Mary of the Immaculate Conception Infant Baptism Guidelines

Through Baptism, God enables us to participate in his life in Jesus Christ and makes us his children. It is through this sacrament that we receive the Holy Spirit and become members of the People of God, of the Body of Christ, which is the Church. Baptism becomes our commitment to grow in this new life and to strive to acquire spiritual maturity.

Baptism is the sacrament of faith which has the Risen Christ as its source, and it is the offer of salvation for all people. Intimately linked to Confirmation and to Eucharist, Baptism is, with these two sacraments, Christian Initiation. The child is baptized in the faith of their parents, godparents, and of the Church. (see *Code of Canon Law*, c. 842, 849; *Catechism of the Catholic Church* #1231, 1263, 1265, 1267-1270)

General Information

- Parents are responsible for bringing their child to the Sacrament of Baptism as soon after birth as possible. Except in the case of necessity, the church is the usual place of baptism.
- In order for the child to be baptized, there must be a reasonable hope that the child will be brought up in the Catholic Faith.
- A record of the child's baptism is maintained where the baptism was conferred Parish of Baptism. The reception of subsequent sacraments must be recorded on this document by the Parish of Baptism.
- Your regular financial contribution to this parish makes it possible for us to have no fees for the baptism classes or materials.

Baptismal Preparation

- Contact the parish office and speak to the Baptism Coordinator, expressing your desire to have your child baptized.
- If you are not already known by one of the parish priests you will be asked to make an appointment to meet one of them prior to beginning baptism preparation.
- Parents must be registered at the parish for at least three months before seeking baptism for their child.
- Parents who are new to the area should contact the Baptism Coordinator regarding baptism for their child.
- Parents must attend some manner of faith formation prior to having their child baptized. This will consist of two baptism preparation sessions at the parish. Parents' commitment and openness to baptism preparation will help develop the faith-life of your child as they mature.
 - Session One: A new creation and nurturing the life of grace. (90 minutes)
 - Session Two: Church tour and the Rite of Baptism. (60 minutes)
- Baptism formation / preparation classes are scheduled on a monthly basis or by appointment with the Baptism Coordinator.

- It is recommended that parents attend the baptism preparation sessions prior to the birth of their child.
- If parents or godparents have attended a baptism formation within the past four years, the class does not have to be repeated. If more than four years have elapsed, parents and godparents are asked to attend classes.

<u>Child</u>

- The information in these guidelines applies only to the Baptism of an infant or young child.
- Children to be baptized who have reached the age of reason (7 years old) receive a different preparation.
- Children who have been baptized in other Christian communities will be prepared to make a profession of faith into the Catholic Church.

Parents

- In order that a child be baptized, it is necessary that the parents' consent, or at least one of the parents, or someone legally standing in their place, and that there be reasonable hope that the child will be brought up in the Catholic faith.
- Parents must complete the baptism information form and submit a copy of the child's birth certification with the completed form to the Baptism Coordinator.
- Parents' marital status will be clarified during the baptismal preparation process. Baptism is not denied if the parents are unmarried or not married in the Roman Catholic Church. However, there may be reason to postpone baptism if the parents are not practicing the Faith, or have no intention of living a Catholic life in harmony with the Gospel.
- If your marital status is not in harmony with the Roman Catholic understanding of sacramental marriage, please inquire as to how the parish may help you enter into a proper sacramental marriage, or if need be, seek a declaration of nullity by the Church.

Godparents

- The child may only have one or two godparents (also called sponsors); if two are chosen, one must be male and the other female.
- In order for someone to be eligible as a godparent they must:
 - be chosen by the parents,
 - have the ability to fulfill the role,
 - be at least 16 years of age, and a confirmed Catholic, who:
 - o has already received the Most Holy Eucharist,
 - is leading a life in harmony with the Catholic Faith (including a valid Marriage within the Catholic Church),
 - o will be a good role model for the one being baptized,
 - \circ $\;$ and be neither the father nor the mother of the child.

- Godparents must attend the baptism preparation sessions or have proof that they have attended classes at another parish.
- Godparents must complete the Sponsor Verification form and have it signed by their pastor.

Christian Witness

- A baptized person who belongs to another Christian community may be admitted only as a 'Christian witness' (not a godparent) provided that there is a least one Roman Catholic godparent (who meets the criteria for a godparent).
- A non-baptized person cannot be a witness.
- A Roman Catholic not in good standing with the Church (i.e. not validly married within the Catholic Church) may not serve as a 'Christian witness.'

Other Parishes

- Non-parishioners are required to take their baptismal preparation in the parish in which they reside and then receive a testimonial letter from their pastor to have their child baptized in another parish.
- Pastors normally have sacramental jurisdiction only over their own parishioners. So, permission is needed from both the home parish and the parish where the baptism will occur.

<u>Ceremony</u>

- Baptisms are celebrated on the second and fourth Sunday of each month immediately following the 11:00 A.M. Mass (approximately 12:15 P.M.).
- Baptism will not be celebrated during Lent.
