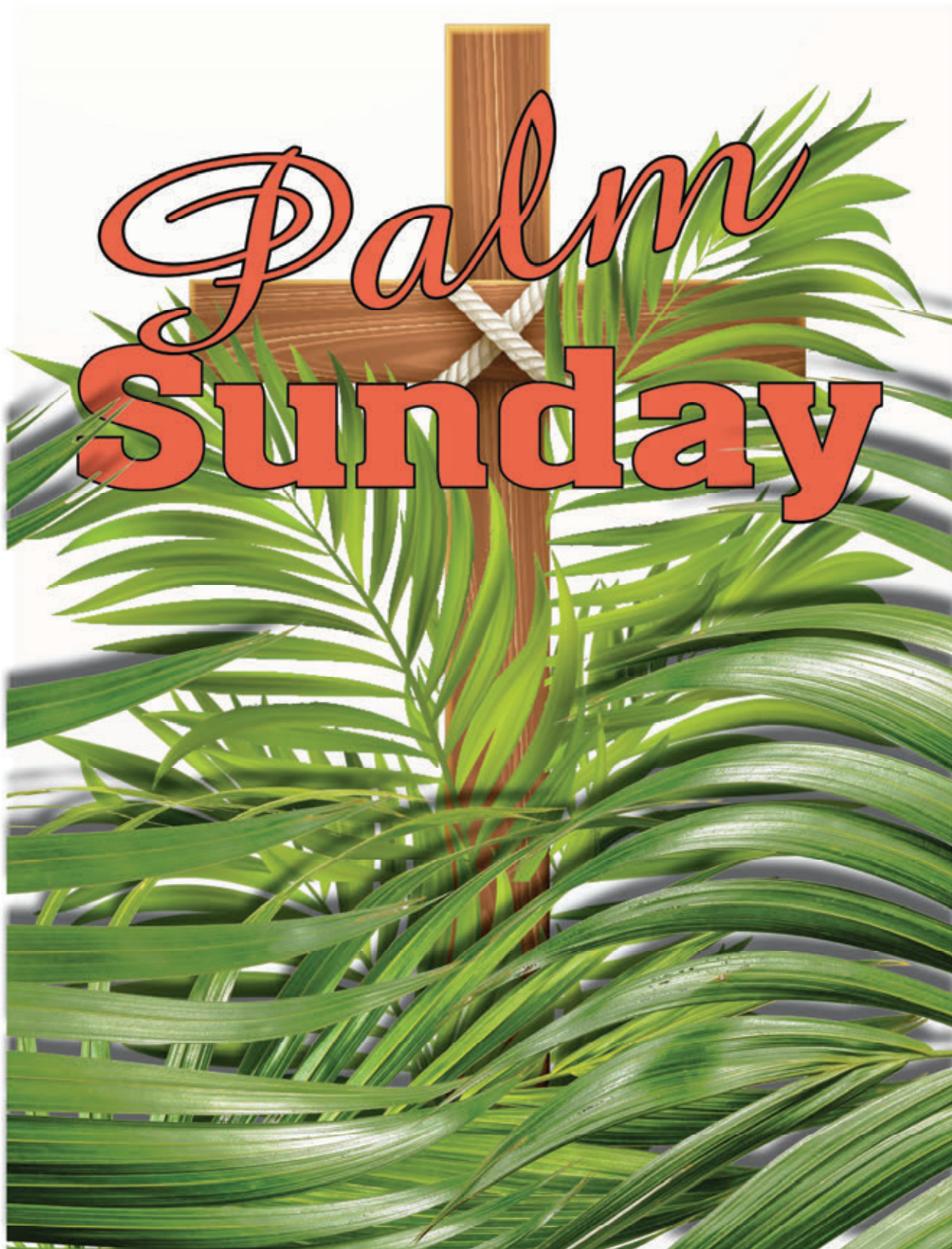

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,



This week we begin to enter into Holy Week, the essence, of our faith. It is the summit of God's unconditional love for sinful humanity and the ultimate sacrifice of the Son of God for our eternal salvation.

Holy Week begins with the commemoration of the Last Supper on Holy Thursday, the crucifixion of Jesus Christ on Good Friday, and His resurrection on Saturday at the Easter Vigil. This commemoration of the Triduum is so rich in symbols which signify the profound mysteries of God's salvific plan for us.

UNITED STATES BANKRUPTCY COURT FOR THE DISTRICT OF NEW JERSEY

In re The Diocese of Camden, New Jersey
