


Download and Install the Microsoft Authenticator Mobile App On Your Mobile Device


The following screenshots and steps are for iPhones. Androids will be similar.

If you already have the Microsoft Authenticator app installed on your mobile device, please open the app, add a new account, and proceed to step 16.


 Go to the app store on your mobile device and search for the Microsoft Authenticator application and install it















16. Point your mobile device's camera at your computer screen that has the QR code window open and your mobile device will automatically recognize the code.



17. You should now see your Ramsey County email address listed in the Microsoft Authenticator app on your mobile device




18. Back on your computer, click the Next button





19. Microsoft will now send an Approve/Deny prompt to your Microsoft Authenticator app on your mobile device. Tap the **Allow** button on your mobile device when it appears.



*If you receive a notification for **Touch ID**, lightly place your finger on the home button of your phone to scan your fingerprint.

*If you receive a notification for **Face ID**, look at your phone's screen so it can scan your face.

Touch ID or Face ID









26. This completes your registration, you can now close the browser window on your computer and close the Authenticator app on your mobile device. Please also make sure to read the tips below regarding MFA and using the Self-Service Password reset tool.

The next time you forget your Ramsey County network password or need to unlock your Ramsey County network account, open up a web browser from any device with an Internet connection and browse to https://ramseycounty.us/passwordreset. Then click the **Reset network password** button to get back into your account by approving the phone call/text and answering the security questions.

Employees can also access the website by going to ramseycounty.us and look under "For Employees" at the bottom of the page. One of the menu items is self-service password reset.

Password Self-Service Reset

The self-service reset tool will allow employees to reset their computer password, without having to contact the IS Service Desk. Once the user enrolls, the tool is available from any browser, even on external computer networks.

Employees must enroll in self-service password reset before using the tool to reset passwords.


Enroll in self-service password reset

Once enrolled, an employee can reset their password from any device.







The next time you log into Office 365 (aka OWA), Citrix, or My Summit using a web browser from a non-Ramsey County network, the mobile device you configured for multi-factor authentication will prompt you to approve your sign-in.

If you ever receive the prompt to approve a sign-in and are not in the process of accessing Office 365 (aka OWA), Citrix, or My Summit, you should tap the Deny button since someone else is trying to log in with your account. Make sure to report the incident to the Service Desk.
