PLEASE consider stepping up to fill one of our board positions. Many of us are already doing more than one job, but there is no question in my mind that all of you possess the skills to help the Tucson Quilters Guild continue strong into the future. I believe that, as a group, we are stronger than Covid, and we have a whole new decade to shine in.

Later in the newsletter, you can read the details of a proposed amendment to our Bylaws called a Force Majeure. If passed in March, this amendment will give the guild some flexibility to continue to operate during the on-going Covid restrictions. This flexibility includes several officers agreeing to stay on past the end of their terms. HOWEVER, once Covid has run its course, and things start opening up again, this flexibility goes away, and we will need to be on course with new officers, and getting back to whatever our "new normal" will be.



Her quilt, "Roses for Travis and Sharon" is pictured in the book, "Rose Sampler Supreme," by Rosemary Mahkan. She has been published in Fons and Porter's Love of Quilting and Quilter's Newsletter magazines and McCall's Quilting.


Peggy is always looking for that next quilting challenge to learn and pass onto her students. This is why her patience and teaching style earned her a nomination for Teacher of the Year for Professional Quilter magazine.



Peggy's lecture is titled "Life Through Quilting". Through this virtual trunk show of her quilts along with the stories of life happening around them, she gives us a humorous and heartwarming look at how quilting plays a big part in our lives.

Arizona Documentation Report

I subscribe to one quilt magazine, Quiltmania. It's bi-monthly and in the July-August 2020 issue, in Carol's editorial, she noted that "The act of sewing is a process of emotional repair." She attributed this quote to an offbeat painter and sculptor, Louise Bourgeois. Carol also included another comment by Louise, "l am what l do with my hands." This really hit home and perhaps it will to you as well. Thomas Jefferson, a favorite founding father, noted that "Every experience deeply felt in life needs to be passed along. Whether it be through words and music, chiseled in stone, painted with a brush or sewn with a needle. It's a way of reaching for immortality." My life has changed; I have even more to stitch! I keep adding projects and now I have one from my cousin, Diana. She hand-pieced 12 quilt blocks in the early 1980s. Remember the color and fabric choices from that time? I made my first quilt about then; what a journey since. Anyway, in Diana's Christmas card, she asked me if I was still interested in turning her quilt blocks into two small quilts (I had offered to do so some years ago). How could I say no? The box arrived last week from New York state. Diana lives on property that George Washington once claimed right after the Revolutionary War. There is an historical marker at the entrance to the very small development. A quilt will go to each of her two daughters. It will be fun to work with the fabrics from the 1980s.

Recently, I got the 3<sup>rd</sup> edition of Barbara Brackman's *Encyclopedia* of *Quilt Patterns*. What a stunning book and a remarkable contrast to the old black and white version as this includes not only more examples, but also is in color!

#### TQG Membership Benefits and Value

Membership in the Tucson Quilters Guild helps us stay connected with other quilters, encourages us to quilt for ourselves and for others, and provides us with resources so that we can learn and grow as quilters. While it may be hard to place a value on all of the membership benefits, at least two have quantifiable financial value: the lectures and workshops by nationally known quilt artists and teachers.

**Lectures** — TQG provides free lectures at our monthly meetings up to eight times each year. Attending these lectures at national quilt shows and conferences like Road to California or AQS QuiltWeek Paducah would cost \$20 for each one hour lecture.

**Workshops** — Similarly, TQG provides one and two day workshops up to eight times each year. TQG offers inperson workshops for \$50 for a one-day workshop. These same workshops would cost more than \$100 on average at national quilt shows and conferences.

TQG's membership fee is currently \$30. A member attending just two meetings with interesting lectures or taking just one of the offered workshops would have a wonderful experience that's valued at more than the cost of a TQS membership.



## Pattern of the Month Topsy-Turvy Square in a Square

**Except** the central piece isn't actually a square, which is where the Topsy-Turvy part comes in!

I know this is a simple variation on a very simple pattern. Where I had fun with it was figuring out ways to play with color and value, and make lots of blocks quickly.

I tried dark prints coordinated with medium value tone-on-tones, and light value prints coordinated with light value tone-on-tones. I also think it would be fabulous in black and white, with half black-background fabrics, and half white-background fabrics. Or go monochromatic, or even totally random. The whole point of all these color variations is to make lots of blocks fast, and end up with a fun, quick quilt. These smaller blocks also combine easily with 8" or 12" blocks if you want to add variety to another pattern.

Like many simple blocks, it can be traditionally pieced or foundation (paper) pieced. For foundation piecing a 4" block, start with the center, and add the four corners in any order. To use the basic pattern for a 6" block, increase the size on your copier to 150%.

#### Cutting for regular piecing:

Use the following patterns (for 4" blocks), to make two sets of coordinated color/value arrangements.


Cut **five each** of an assortment of dark prints, and an assortment of medium tone-on-tone coordinating colors. This will make a total of a total of ten blocks, five with dark centers, and five with lighter centers. These will make a nine-patch and one leftover. When you are cutting for regular piecing, remember that THE CORNERS ARE NOT INTERCHANGEABLE. I marked each side of the center and its coordinating corner with matching letters.













Paper-Piecing: Full-size pattern for 4" block

Cut multiple fabrics to make as many blocks as needed Switch light and dark centers to go with opposite value corners
