Semester Reports

The staff are busily preparing Semester One reports to be sent home to families in the last week of term. Parents are to expect a report that provides information on their child’s learning in all key learning areas and compares their child’s achievement against the state-wide syllabus standards. Your child’s report will include a written comment that identifies their strengths and their goals for their future learning. Students from Years 1-6 will have their achievement reported using the A-E achievement scale. A grade distribution table will be available for viewing at the office from the start of Term 3 if parents are interested in looking at the grades across the school. This information is numerical and does not identify individual students. If you have any questions regarding your child’s report, please make a time to speak to your child’s teacher. Students whose learning is impacted by disability, may receive a report where achievement is compared against their personalised learning plan. This process is discussed with parents.

Vehicles on Site

Schools are required to have plans in place to manage vehicle movements on site to ensure the safety of our students. As a general rule, vehicles do not enter the school site without approval from the Principal and without strict safety measures in place which includes the use of an observer. We have installed a yellow chain across the driveway in Ulaka Street to allow safe access for the special transport vehicles. These vehicles drive in, drop off the students to our support classes and then reverse out of the driveway to leave. This access is not to be used by any other vehicle. The gate on Wales Street is for staff use only. There is regular student movement near this area so parent vehicles are not permitted. The gate will be locked once staff arrive at school in the mornings and opened again once the students have left the school in the afternoon. Please assist us in maintaining a safe environment for our students.

Student Attendance

'Regular attendance at school for every student is essential if students are to achieve their potential, and increase their career and life options. Schools in partnerships with parents are responsible for promoting the regular attendance of students.' <https://education.nsw.gov.au/policy-library/policies/school-attendance-policy>

Students are required to attend school every day the school is open for instruction. The school regularly reviews its attendance data and implements strategies to support regular student attendance at school. Parents are required to provide an explanation for absences by telephone, written note, email or via the Skoolbag app within 7 days from the first day of any period of absence. The school sends a SMS message to parents on the first day of absence. If a regular pattern of poor attendance is identified, staff will make regular contact by phone with parents to support a return to regular attendance and may implement different strategies at school to support the student. If attendance doesn't improve after these efforts, a note will be sent to families identifying an attendance concern, and if improvement is still not seen, the school will seek support from the Home School Liaison Officer.

School Improvements
