Program updates: Nutrition update

Currently there are 115 Nutrition Sciences majors. Please see page 4 article on Mr. Wilfong, a new Nutrition Sciences lecturer. There was also a search this year to add an additional full time tenured faculty position in Nutrition Sciences. The search will continue for a PhD., R.D. There has been an upgrade to the food testing equipment used in Food Science and Experimental Foods, made available through private donations to the Food Science area. A measuring device made by Texture Technologies is now available in our new food science lab and with this equipment students will be able to measure volume, tenderness, resistance and other physical characteristics of food products. This brings our assessment ability to the level seen in food science labs at Iowa State and other land grant institutions. Our didactic program, which prepares students to enter nutrition and dietetic internships is in the process of a selfstudy and will host a site visit in March of 2014.

Apparel Merchandising update

The Apparel Merchandising program area continues to improve to meet the changes in the fashion industry as a whole. Students have the choice between Entrepreneurship and Business Administration as a minor with the hours for each already included in the number of hours for the BSFCS degree in Apparel Merchandising.

Students in Apparel Merchandising are beginning their online portfolios during the freshman year, which allows them to make changes and updates to the site throughout their Sophomore, Junior, and Senior years at Baylor



and be better prepared for their internship and career. Graduates are securing jobs in various segments of the industry such as buying, product development, allocation, visual merchandising, planogram design (store planning), showroom sales, retail management, and global sourcing.

Interior Design update

The Interior Design faculty and students are well settled into Goebel and loving it. After a major move and accreditation site visit the previous year, this academic year was quiet and peaceful. Greta Buehrle attended IDEC National Conference in Indianapolis, IN in February. CFS update

Child & Family Studies (CFS) program has again seen growth with over 110 majors and 75 minors. We have had a successful year with students earning competitive placement in child life internships and employment in prestigious hospital programs with Arkansas Children's, Cook Children's, Cincinnati Children's, and Vanderbilt. In addition, we have had students accepted into the Military Extension Internship program and several competitive ministry based internships. With a continued emphasis on experience based learning, CFS faculty have cultivated ongoing relationships with a variety of community organizations and agencies such as Talitha Koum, Klaras Children's Center for Early Childhood Intervention, Arrow Child & Family Ministries, and Generations Adoptions.

Cotton grant

As a part of its Cotton Educational Grant program for universities, Cotton Incorporated funded a proposal submitted by **Drs. Yoo and Divita** entitled "Forever Fashionable" for over \$12,000. For the semester-long learning experience about cotton's performance and aesthetic benefits, Apparel Design and Merchandising students created educational materials about cotton as a fashionable fiber. Projects included designing garments, written assignments, and display boards. Creative entries were judged by a panel of faculty and the winning entries were exhibited and awarded after the Baylor Student Apparel Show.

TEA grant

The second year of the Texas Education Agency, TEA grant has been quite busy. **Drs. Weems and Walters** received the grant and

the purpose of the funding was to write curriculum for Food Science under Career and Technology, Hospitality, and



Tourism and to transform the Food Science course into a high school lab science credit. At the end of August, the iBook was submitted and reports from future users reflected a high level of excitement on its availability. Presentation of the grant's focus and purpose was well received at the National Career Cluster Institute.

Dairy Max grant

Completion of the first year of data collection resulted in a preliminary report focused on students receiving Breakfast in the Classroom compared to students who did not have this opportunity. Outcomes of the initial research process showed a significant difference in the intake of vitamin D and calcium with those students receiving breakfast in the classroom having higher intakes. This particular finding stressed the importance of this meal as a source of two of the nutrients of concern in elementary school children. Dr. Tanya Brice was the primary investigator for this study and she was assisted by Lauren Hardy, Adam Sams, Catherine Luedtke, and Dr. Suzy Weems.

Research activity

In addition to being dedicated to their teaching responsibilities, our faculty have been busy conducting, publishing, and presenting research in their respective fields. The department is proud of the many contributions our professors have made and the increase in students participating in research activities. It not only gave me a better insight into potential careers, but it also exposed me to people working in the industry that will be valuable connections to maintain."

Mission Guatemala trip

For the second consecutive year, nine Nutrition Sciences (NS) students and **Dr. Walter** traveled to Panajachel, Solola, Guatemala for an eight-day



mission trip. The NS students planned three cooking classes for junior high students. This type of activity had never been provided to these students and they were enthusiastic and eager to cook with the Baylor

students. NS students also helped measure height, weight, blood pressure, and pulse of elementary school children that had received nutrition services from Mission Guatemala, a Methodist mission program, to establish a benchmark of their growth status. Their growth in comparison to international standards will be assessed in the future to determine effectiveness of these feeding programs. Our students also helped prepare a lunch, went to market with a local social worker, and helped install a stove in a family's home. The stove is specially designed to use less wood than the traditional stove in most homes. Lastly students taught nutrition activities and performed puppet plays about nutrition to grades one through six at a remote mountain school. 
and assist with ticketing and promotions. Everyone's hard work paid off, as all 400 tickets were sold out prior to the show. After the show and the design awards, all
