John Chrysostom once said, "Things themselves do not remain, but their effects do. Therefore we should not be mean and calculating with what we have but give with a generous hand."

Indeed, your generous hands and hearts continue to be an inspiration to me. Here are some mental snapshots that I've taken of you around the church this past month.

- An army of willing workers showed up for the better part of a Sunday to participate in a work bee.
- Our treasurer reported at a recent Finance Committee meeting that through June our tithe was up 8.87% and our operating budget was up a whopping 27.55% (which, you may remember, we raised \$100,000) over last year! Put another way, through June, we received 42% of our operating budget for the year—something we have never done before.
- Church members filled 200 back-to-school backpacks with supplies for under-resourced kids in our community. Your generosity was so overwhelming! Many of you brought additional school supplies after we ran out of backpacks!

The Way I See It

I do not know how long the Apostle John was a prisoner on the Isle of Patmos. I do know that he received important messages for the last days. Messages from God that were communicated by angels "flying in the midst of heaven". Angels fly fast and John could understand that fact. God could have exclusively used angels to take the Gospel, but He has given us, His children, the privilege to partner with Him and take the everlasting Gospel to the world.

It is amazing how the Holy Scriptures came together when one considers the stories, letters and expressions of praise were hand-written by different authors in various places, and preserved over a long span of time. Neither Paul nor Peter had any question of God's authorship, "All Scripture is given by inspiration of God..." and "...holy men of God spoke as they were moved by the Holy Spirit".

Centuries passed and much of the world hadn't received word of "the everlasting Gospel". The apostles and the early Christians were gone. Gradually false teachings, harsh judgements, religious/political oppression brought a darkness to the hearts and minds of the people. "The everlasting Gospel" needed proclamation with "angel" speed. Three major inventions and developments provided the speed which changed and continues to change the world:

- 1) **Printing** The printing press with moveable type enabled the Bible to be available in the language of the common people. Printing greatly assisted the work of the Reformation that opened Biblical truths like "The just shall live by faith." However, there was a much larger world to reach with "the everlasting Gospel" and another form of speed made that possible.
- 2) **Transportation** For thousands of years, travel was done by walking, using four-legged animals, or rowing a boat. The development of steam and gasoline-powered engines was the opening to further and faster travel by land, sea and air. The opportunities for preaching "the everlasting Gospel" became more accessible. However, there were and still are unreached areas. A new type of speed opened to the world.
- 3) Communication technology Of course, the telephone comes to mind. But in times past, to see and hear a speaker required being there in person. A new form of communication, beginning with radio and television, changed that. Cyberspace technology has evolved so rapidly that information can reach into every nation and language via satellite and internet. Today, the good news of "the everlasting Gospel" is being sent by a means that the Apostle John, on the Isle of Patmos, could never have imagined.

The Three Angels Messages are circling Planet Earth by printed page, faster transportation and satellite/internet technology.




loop in their elevators, singing, 'I did it my way.'
