“The Global Politics of Technoscience: Subjects, Objects, and Temporalities”

Technology improves lives. How often have we heard that truism, usually coupled to statistics about longer life spans, lower disease incidence, increased food and energy production, reduced disaster rates, and other facts that seem to suggest all is for the best in the best of possible worlds? After all, first in line for students of politics at any level is the very question of the “we”: who is in it, who out, on what terms, under what constraints, and with what consequences? These questions have acquired new urgency with the rise of a global technoscience, deployed and governed by corporations that the law sometimes treats as if they are persons while they operate and exercise their own powers as if they are states. These powers, moreover, have a dimensionality all their own as people have come to recognize that politics is not merely a struggle over present means and ends, but over the shape of the future. In this talk, I approach the politics of global technoscience from perspectives consistent with this meeting’s emphasis on the darker sides of globalization, asking who constitutes the subjects and objects of governance and with what implications for welfare in our increasingly *un*-common future.

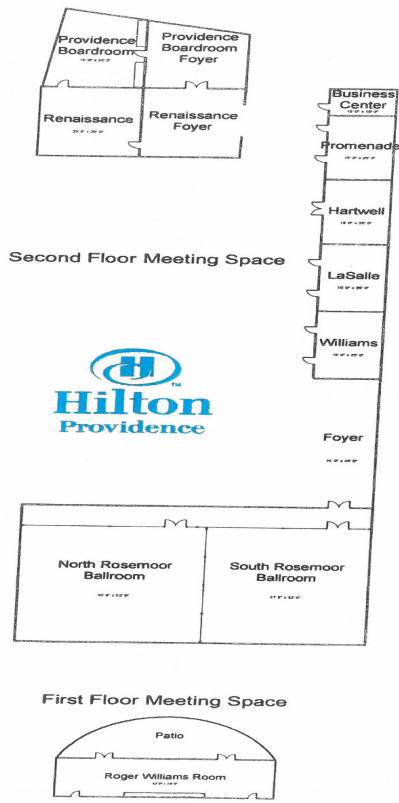
