

## Healthy Iowans Overview



- Healthy lowans is lowa's five-year health needs assessment & improvement plan that focuses on the state's priority health issues & provides a blueprint for addressing them
- Collaborative process that includes local community health assessments & stakeholder groups/agencies from across the state

Data Source: Analysis of local CHNA&HIPs.



#### **Healthy Iowans Recommendations**

Data Source: Analysis of stakeholder input.

**Burden on Iowans: Is Iowa in bottom 20 states nationally?** 

Data Source: America's Health Rankings, other secondary data sources.

Health Inequity: Are certain populations disproportionately affected?

Data Source: IDPH data, Iowa Health Profile, secondary data sources.

**Gap Analysis: Is there evidence for other issues not already identified?** 

Data Source: IDPH data, Iowa Health Profile, H.P. 2020, Secondary data

**Result: Combine information into State Health Assessment** 



#### CHNA & HIP: What is it?



- **\*** CHNA = Community Needs Assessment
- HIP = Health Improvement Plan
- A report on a community's health needs/issues & what can be done about them
- Local boards of health in collaboration with community partners discuss issues & priorities



#### **CHNA Analysis Process**



- Qualitative analysis of CHNA reports serves as the foundation for critical issues addressed in Healthy Iowans
- Issues identified in CHNA reports classified into pre-defined categories
  - Categories based on 2011 analysis, Healthy People 2020, & emerging issues
  - Added social determinant categories to better define underlying factors that contribute to health issues



#### CHNA Analysis (continued)



- Over 120 needs & tags for lifespan & special populations
  - Youth, elderly, minority, low income, disability
- In total, 98 counties identified 2,461 issues
- Analysis & categorization of those issues is the foundation for Healthy Iowans
  - Ability to roll needs up in different ways



#### CHNA Analysis (continued)



- Depending on comprehensiveness of report/assessment the list may not reflect all of the needs/issues that exist within a particular community
- Results only reflect what was cited in the CHNA report submitted by each county

- Access issues placed in HL category were regrouped into the HI category (e.g.: Access to mental health services)
- Priority weights within categories made very little difference in order

## Population Weighted Analysis



- Issues that drop out of the Top 10:
  - #6: Tobacco/Nicotine Use (14th)
  - #9: SDH: Access HS: Oral/Dental Health (13<sup>th</sup>)
  - #10: Diabetes (20<sup>th</sup>)
- Other notable changes:
  - Water Quality & Safety (would drop from 11<sup>th</sup> to 26<sup>th</sup>)
  - Emergency Response: Network Infrastructure, Plan, Notification (13<sup>th</sup> to 31<sup>st</sup>)



## Population Weighted Analysis



- Other notable changes (continued):
  - Injury: Falls (17th to 23rd)
  - Injury: Motor Vehicle Crashes (17th to 28th)
  - Radon (17<sup>th</sup> to 29<sup>th</sup>)
  - Neighborhood & Built Environment (would move up from 56<sup>th</sup> to 21<sup>st</sup>)
  - General & other access to health services issues, community awareness of health issues/health literacy, safe/affordable housing, & health insurance each would move into the top 20.



## Elderly Wellness (65+)



- 52 counties specifically mentioned elderly as a target population
- **\*** Top 5 issues:
  - Injury: Falls (20 counties)
  - Aging in Place; Support Services (13)
  - Mental Health, Illness & Suicide, including Alzheimer's / Dementia (11)
  - Flu Immunizations (11)
  - SDH: Transportation (9)

Others: Chronic Disease, NWS, Substance Abuse



- Climate change—Environmental Health & Preparedness implications



#### Healthy Iowans Recommendations



- About 120 stakeholders submitted up to 3 priority health issues
- Issues identified mostly mirrored the CHNA analysis results
- Some exceptions:
  - Emphasis on data—timeliness, relevance, ease of use, etc.
  - Emphasis on policy level change
  - More specific intervention focused issues & target populations
