FKCC offers an array of associate degrees and career training programs to suit your academic and professional goals.

Associate in Arts

The A.A. is a transfer degree that provides a course of study equivalent to those offered to freshman and sophomore students in the lower division of Florida's state universities.

The degree includes 36 hours of general education which parallels the university requirements and 24 hours of electives in preparation for a major area of study.

Associate in Science

The A.S. is a degree that prepares students for immediate employment in a specific occupational field and prepares students to transfer into a Florida university.

The degree includes 15-18 credit hours of transferable general education courses, as well as transferable technical courses.

Associate in Applied Science

The A.A.S. is a college-level technical degree that prepares students for immediate employment in a specific occupational field.

The A.A.S. provides the same career preparation as the A.S. but is not designed as a college transfer program. The degree may transfer to some universities under special articulation agreements.

TO YOUR FUTURE.

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The Technical Certificate and Advanced Technical Diploma (ATD) are one-year (or less) programs which prepare students to enter the workforce. Many of these programs may be applied toward to an A.S. or an A.A.S. degree.

Vocational Training

A Post-Secondary Adult Vocational (PSAV) program consists of (usually) one year or less of prescribed vocational credits (noncollege level credit), which provide students with specific skills for immediate job entry.

SEAMLESS UNIVERSITY TRANSFER

ften referred to as the "university transfer" degree, the Associate in Arts (A.A.) is the smart start toward your choice of hundreds of bachelor degree programs. During your two years at FKCC, you take similar general education courses as a freshman and sophomore at a university, totaling 60 credit hours.

One of the greatest advantages of earning an A.A. at FKCC is the College's "2+2" full articulation with all of Florida's 12 public and 31 independent universities. In addition, FKCC has articulation agreements with nearly a dozen other institutions—making it easy to take the next step.

Create a plan

A.A. students are encouraged to think ahead from the very beginning. Your academic advisor will help you develop a "University Transfer Plan," which will align your elective courses to the major in which you intend to pursue a bachelor's degree. Keep in mind that there may be additional requirements and prerequisite courses that exceed 60 credits, so it is important that you work with your advisor and consult the FKCC catalog.



Your gateway to a variety of federally-funded financial aid opportunities is through the FAFSA, the Free Application for Federal Student Aid. The application is a three-step process that begins with applying for a PIN at www.fafsa.ed.gov. Students and parents may also pursue federal direct loans, such as subsidized and unsubsidized Stafford Loans and the Parent PLUS Loan.
