COUNCIL CAR PARK AND PLAY AREA

This is a reminder that parents have the responsibility for their children's safety when they are in the council play park. Teachers at the school will be on duty at the school gate and will return children who have not been picked up to the school office in order that parents are contacted.

More importantly, if you cannot pick your children up in the afternoon or there is a change as to the procedure you need to contact the school prior to 2.30pm the time taken to get a message to a classroom is not instantaneous, it takes time. If lateness is a regular occurrence



I ask that parents remind their children to be aware of strangers and of the time when they are playing unsupervised at the council play park. Children should be instructed to return home or to the school office if they find themselves without their parent whilst playing at the park. I also ask parents to be extremely careful when driving in the car park. Please be very responsible and be extremely alert for children in the car park. A reminder that signs indicate to reverse park, so parents are not reversing once children are in the carpark.

Recently, we had a visit from a Bus Ways inspector to inform us on the importance of our children using an Opal card. Please note, that if your child catches the bus to and from school, the only way the company can record how many use the service is by the amount of times an Opal card is swiped. If bus ways believe the service route is not being used, they may cancel certain timetables, routes etc. Your assistance is greatly appreciated.



Dear Parents/Care Givers,

Welcome to an exciting 2019 at Eastern Creek Public School Library.

Borrowing from the Library has begun for children in Years 1-6 and will begin next week for Kindergarten children. If possible, please have your child return his/her library books to the Returns Box in the Library between 8.40am and 8.55am on the morning of their Library day.

To protect books between school and home all children require a Library Bag. This can be a cloth bag, eco bag, pillowcase or strong plastic bag with their name and class clearly marked on the front. Kindergarten and Year 1 children may borrow 1 book; Year 2 can borrow up to 2 books; Year 3 can borrow up to 3 books; Year 4 can borrow up to 4 books; Year 5 can borrow up to 5 books and Year 6 can borrow up to 6 books each week.

The Library is open before school from 8.30am Mondays and after school until 3.30pm on Mondays and Wednesdays. You are most welcome to come and share a story with your child and explore the many resources we have on offer for your child to borrow.

Premier's Reading Challenge

Participation in the Premier's Reading Challenge will be encouraged again this year. I will be sending a Personal Reading Log (including instructions) home with every child in Years 2-6 to keep a record of the books they read. I will manage the reading longs for children in Kindergarten and Year 1. Please read this carefully, write down when your child reads a PRC book and when they complete their required number of books (20 for 3-6; 30 for K-2) please enter the titles online using your child's Department of Education username and password to login and then send the completed list to me for confirmation.
