The following are excerpts from Mr. Marcus' recent discussions and appearances.

"The Office of Emperor is a serious endeavor being the product of over two years of planning and thinking by a small group of dedicated persons that San Francisco, as the leader, as the mecca, as the homeland of homosexual free dom of thought, expression and lifestyles, should be the birthplace of a masculine image in its leadership. The Office of Emperor will create a Council with representatives of various groups we have within our way of life. It is pretty obvious to all of you that the various groups such as The Society of Individual Rights, the Tavern Guild, The Metropolitan Community Church, The Gay Activists Alliance, The Gay Liberation Front, etc., are NOT unified. Several attempts have been made to do this thru a unity council, but because of petty and jealous ridden rivalries which do none of us any good, nothing has been accomplished. Our liaisons with the establishment are weak and ineffective - the only time we can truthfully see a spark of unity is when one person gets hurt in a motorcycle accident or becomes the victim of some illness - then everyone turns out to spend a few dollars at an auction. This is not UNITY. '

"I say to you, all persons who meet the public in your daily work - it is up to you to see that the importance of the Emperor's Office is taken seriously.
"IT IS NOT A POPULARITY CONTEST, NOT A BEAUTY CONTEST OR I WOULDN'T BE RUNNING." It is up to you to see that the Emperor contest is a success to inaugurate the First Emperor of San Francisco at California Hall on September 29th. It is up to you to see that the right person is elected, he being the person who is familiar with and known in all the organizations; the person who is not just a member but active within those organizations; the person who is aware of what's happening in the Community, the person who is in contact on good terms with leaders in other cities as well, both straight and gay. It is up to you to elect a man who can speak with other men - who can talk to the leadership of SIR, The Tavern Guild, the bike clubs, the drag queens, the drag enter-tainers, the Empress, the hustlers in the Tenderloin, the 18 - 21 year olds and the gay prisoners just released from hell in prisons that is unlike anything you've ever experienced and I hope to God you never have to experience. The person who is familiar with all the interworking of our City Government and very familiar with City Appoint-ed heads and elected representatives who can express himself in writing, in speech and in actions that benefit his fellow man."

"The Office of Emperor is a man's job, A REAL MAN. I hope you will elect a man to do it, I ask you to elect me. Thank You."
