I gave my first sermon in early 1996 at Lynnhaven United Methodist Church in Virginia Beach. I was being mentored by the church's pastor, Bruce Tuttle, now retired. Bruce asked me to preach one Sunday when the Gospel text was John 2, where Jesus changes water into wine at the wedding in Cana in Galilee. My sermon title was "I Saw the Signs," and I had a great time preaching.

Maybe too great a time: There were two services at Lynnhaven, and Bruce told me in between them, "Maybe talk a little slower next time." I may have talked quickly out of sheer excitement. I said later that preaching was as much fun as being on a roller coaster, and I was happy to see friends from work like James and Mary in the congregation. I also saw my friend Will sitting on the back pew at the early service, but I didn't see a sign that he sent me that morning: He told me later that he was motioning like a traffic control officer, pressing down with his palms to tell me to slow down. I must have been talking too fast to notice. Again, I had a great time preaching, and still do. I'd like to invite you to have a great time, too, by becoming a lay speaker. It involves some training, and it'll help the church, because, with my being a reservist, I have to miss at least three Sundays a year at Epworth, and if I move to a new reserve command next year, it could be more.

I hope to extend with my current command, which allows me to reschedule drills two Friday mornings a month so that I don't have to miss Sundays at Epworth, except for mandatory drills each summer and fall, and during my two weeks of annual training, scheduled this year for May 16-27.

My last command, now stood down, drilled in Newport News. I was pastoring in Clifton Forge at the same time, and I used to have to miss one Sunday a month at Central United Methodist Church. I don't know if I could have rescheduled drills then, but since Central UMC had two lay speakers in the congregation, the church was able to cover my absences. The two shared the pulpit when I was away.

I ask you to consider becoming a lay speaker to help cover my absences due to the reserves. I'll know this summer if I can extend with my command, and if not, I may have to drill outside of Hampton Roads. I hope it doesn't come to that, but I hope you'll consider becoming a lay speaker nonetheless. If God interests you in this ministry, please let me know, and I'll keep you informed of training events.
