

From our Community Lay Director

Hello, my name is Sue Miller, your Community Lay Director. I took my walk to Emmaus in November of 1999 at Calvary UMC in Jackson and sat at the table of The Melting Martha's-because we cried all weekend long!!

A little story for you-maybe some of you can relate...when I took my walk I kind of just did it because my parents-mainly my mom, pushed me to go. I honestly should not have been there, being the state of mind, I was in. I had just lost our first and only baby a few months before and I was an emotional wreck and was really mad at God.

When I got there, I was not happy, I had an attitude the whole time, I did not feel good-at the time I was like the woman who hemorrhaged for 12 years. It got so bad that I eventually had to have a hysterectomy. Anyways, I went through the motions, still not knowing why I was there-remind you of anyone yet?! Friday came and I had migraines so bad that I was popping ibuprophen like it was candy and then developed a bad rash all over my face and neck. I just wanted to go home. Then Saturday came, I still wasn't happy and still had an attitude. Then dying moments happened. Still not sure what I was doing there, but followed along.

Then it happened, the Spiritual Director on that walk-Kathy Nixs sat with me for almost an hour. I missed two talks I believe, but she stayed with me in the chapel until I filled up about ten of the 3X5 cards with baggage that had a tight hold on me. She even said, If I could shake you and get away with it, I would, but as a Pastor I just can't. Without touching me she shook every bit of baggage holding me down, and because God sent her to me, I was forever changed from that moment. My attitude changed, I was literally about 50 pounds lighter than I was, and I learned to participate instead of anticipate and regret being there. I learned that on Sunday, after closing, that I didn't want to go home and I actually wanted to stay and get more-remind you of anyone?



Who would have thought that one day, that stubborn, closed minded, attitude filled girl would one day be head of the Emmaus Community of Jackson?!!

I am still amazed at the work God did in me and through the prayers of a ton of people who didn't even know me. He sent the vessel to plant the seeds and to show me the road, but God provided the healing, He provided people to stand in the gap with me and that was all due to Emmaus. If you have felt down or distant for whatever reason, think about your walk and what that spark was on your Sunday, at closing when you gave those two answers-what the walk meant to you and what do you plan on doing about it? Do you remember your answers? Do you remember how on fire you were at that moment? Emmaus hasn't gone anywhere, but maybe you have...we are only a step away! We would love to see all of your faces again!! Whether on the board, or on the walks as servants in one form or another!!

My term as your Community Lay Director has come to a close already-man that flew right on by!! I will hand over the reigns to a new CLD in December to begin their term in January.

It has been my honor and privilege to serve in this position for the past 3 years. Don't think you are getting rid of me though, because I will still be around and making sure we all work hard to keep this Emmaus Community going and thriving forward.
