Why ICP was required

- Equity and consistency of care
- Improve patient comfort
- Appropriate referrals
- Increase in quit attempts
- Reduce incidence of patients smoking within acute sites
- Increase staff knowledge
- Increase availability of Nicotine Replacement Therapy (NRT)





Integrated Care Pathway

- Structured guidelines
- Evidence based
- Specific patient/client group
- Clinical record
- Provides evaluation of outcomes for continuous quality improvement

- Clinical Governance staff














Referrals 2 months pilot period (2012) in comparison to previous year (2011)






Quits Set (Hairmyres)








Hairmyres Hospital Follow ups









