




Welcome to the Colour Edge 2022 Print Competition

This is a great opportunity to showcase and share some of the fantastic images the group has been capturing throughout the year in the Botanic Gardens. If you are interested or have any questions, please contact Pamela Finger. Below are some guidelines for the exhibition.

- Maximum of two (2) large photos per person will be chosen for the exhibition. Frames will be supplied by Mackay Regional Botanic Gardens.
- Photos displayed in the exhibition must have been taken by the participant during the Photo Walkabout during 2021/2022.
- Images cannot be sold as part of the exhibition.
- Maximum of 20 frames will be hung.
- All images will be labelled with photo credit given to the photographer.
- Images must be delivered and printed at photographers' cost.



How will images be selected?

Each participant has the opportunity to submit digital copies (maximum of 5) in high resolution with a minimum of 7MB. Digital images need to be submitted via email no later than February 15 to Pamela Finger. Pamela's email is pamela.finger@bigpond.com

Salon Organisation:

- The DPI and Print entries will be judged by a panel of 3 PSQ accredited judges on Saturday 9th April 2022 at the Hinterland Baptist Church, 405 Hinkler Drive, Worongary on the Gold Coast, starting at 9.00am.
- First, Second and Third places will be selected in each category and will be awarded a certificate. First place winners will also receive a PSQ silver medallion.
- Champion Awards will be selected for A-Grade and Non-A-Grade Digital Projected Images and A-Grade and Non-A-Grade Prints and awarded with a PSQ gold medallion and a certificate.
- All awards will be announced at the Gala Dinner of the PSQ Convention 2022, at Mon Komo, Redcliffe, Queensland.
 - If there are changes to the Convention due to Covid-19, alternative arrangements for presentation of awards will be advised.
- Entry Conditions: All work and elements must be the work of the entrant and be of photographic origin. Use of brushes and textures— only those that make adjustments to the entrant's own images, without adding elements including text tool.

Definition of A-Grade and Non-A-Grade:

For this competition an entrant has to enter as an A grade entrant if he/she is an A grade member of their PSQ affiliated organisation and accordingly an entrant has to enter as an Non-A grade entrant if he/she is a C, B, AB or any Non-top grade member of their PSQ affiliated organisation.

Section Definitions:

Nature:

Nature photography is restricted to the use of the photographic process to depict all branches of natural history, except anthropology and archaeology, in such a fashion that a well-informed person will be able to identify the subject material and certify its honest presentation. The story telling value of a photograph must be weighed more than the pictorial quality while maintaining high technical quality. Human elements shall not be present, except where those human elements are integral parts of the nature story such as nature subjects, like barn owls or storks, adapted to an environment modified by humans, or where those human elements are in situations depicting natural forces, like hurricanes or tidal waves. Scientific bands, scientific tags or radio collars on wild animals are permissible. Photographs of human created hybrid plants, cultivated plants, feral animals, domestic animals, or mounted specimens are ineligible, as is any form of manipulation that alters the truth of the photographic statement.

No techniques that add, relocate, replace, or remove pictorial elements except by cropping are permitted. Techniques that enhance the presentation of the photograph without changing the nature story or the pictorial content, or without altering the content of the original scene, are permitted including HDR, focus stacking and dodging/ burning. Techniques that remove elements added by the camera, such as dust spots, digital noise, and film scratches, are allowed. Stitched images are not permitted. All allowed adjustments must appear natural. Infrared images, either direct-captures or derivations, are not allowed.

People:

This section includes images of people that may range from head to full length studies and may include accessories or backgrounds that are in character with the subject. This subject includes portraiture.

Social Documentary:

Social Documentary Photography or concerned photography is the recording of what the world looks like, with a social and/or environmental focus. It is a form of documentary photography, with the aim to draw the publics' attention to ongoing social issues.

The entrant must ensure that there is no attempt to misrepresent reality by manipulating the image's content, context or meaning through image editing or post-production.

Post-production is limited to minor global adjustments such as spotting dust and scratches, dodging and burning, and adjusting tonal and colour values. Elements or areas within the image cannot be removed or covered up, nor may new elements be added. Cropping the image is permitted, as is conversion to black and white.

Photo Travel:

A Photo Travel image expresses the characteristic features or culture of a land as they are found naturally. There are no geographic limitations. Images from events or activities arranged specifically for photography, or of subjects directed or hired for photography are not permitted. Close up pictures of people or objects must include features that provide information about the location.

Techniques that add, relocate, replace or remove any element of the original image, except by cropping, are not permitted. The only allowable adjustments are removal of dust or digital noise, restoration of the appearance of the original scene, and complete conversion to greyscale monochrome. Other derivations, including infrared, are not permitted. All images must look natural.

Mono: (Monochrome)

Any photograph containing shades of only one colour. If toning is carried out, it must be over the total photograph - partial toning and/or the addition of one extra colour are not acceptable in a monochrome section.



2022 Inter-Club Competition Categories

Silhouette - A silhouette is a dark image of a subject against a bright background. In reality silhouette images are often pictures which are more semi-silhouettes where the main subject is not quite solid jet black but very close.

Negative Space – "Negative space" as opposed to "Positive Space" is the area which surrounds the main subject of interest in your photo. "Negative space" defines and emphasises the main subject of a photo, drawing your eye to it. It provides "breathing room", giving your eyes somewhere to rest and preventing your image from appearing too cluttered. All of this adds up to a more engaging composition.



Climate Change – Is considered a long-term change in the average weather patterns that have come to define Earth's local, regional, and global climates. These changes have a broad range of observed effects that are synonymous with the term.

Frequently used images fall into the "negative impact" category such as imagery depicting the most visible and disturbing impacts of climate change: extreme weather, historic droughts, temperature records, ice-free Arctic summers, rising seas, melting glaciers, coastal erosion, storm surges, forest fires, ruined crops, food riots, dried riverbeds, forced migration and refugees; etc.

In contrast, photographers can consider "positive impact" images to shift the global climate change conversation from despair to optimism, from apathy to action and to celebrate the many opportunities such as economic, environmental and health which can be gained from transitioning to a clean energy economy.

Creative photography such as Composites and Photo-manipulations are accepted in this category.

Non-A Grade Open - Any image supplied by a non-A Grade member in the club. Clubs where club members are un-graded may submit 3 images by novice members.

People/Portrait (Mood/Emotion/Drama) (P) - A photograph of a person or persons that may range from a head study to fill body length. This section includes candid photographs and formal portraits which show some sort of emotion, drama, or mood. E.g., a couple in a romantic setting; a happy child at Christmas or someone who looks obviously sad or angry etc; or people in a dramatic scene.

Scapes (S) - An image featuring an expansive view without any humans dominating the scene. Urban, Rural, Sea, Sky Scapes, and traditional Landscapes are all included in this category.

Nature & Wildlife (N) - Nature photography records all branches of natural history except anthropology and archaeology. This includes all aspects of the physical world, both animate and inanimate, that have not been made or modified by humans.

Nature images must convey the truth of the scene that was photographed. A well-informed person should be able to identify the subject of the image and be satisfied that it has been presented honestly and that no unethical practices have been used to control the subject or capture the image. Images that directly or indirectly show any human activity that threatens the life or welfare of a living organism are not allowed.

2022 Inter-Club Competition Categories

The most important part of a Nature image is the nature story it tells. High technical standards are expected and the image must look natural. **Adding a vignette or blurring the background during processing is not allowed.**

Objects created by humans, and evidence of human activity, are allowed in Nature images only when they are a necessary part of the Nature story.

Photographs of human-created hybrid plants, cultivated plants, feral animals, domesticated animals, human-created hybrid animals and mounted or preserved zoological specimens **are not allowed.**

Images taken with subjects under controlled conditions, such as zoos, **are allowed**. Controlling live subjects by chilling, anaesthetic or any other method of restricting natural movement for the purpose of a photograph **is not allowed**.

Modification that changes the truth of a Nature image **is not allowed**. Images may be cropped. However, any technique that removes, adds or moves any part of the image **is not allowed**. Techniques that remove elements added by the camera, such as dust spots, digital noise and lens flare **are allowed**.

Complete conversion of colour images to greyscale monochrome **is allowed**. Partial conversion, toning and infrared captures or conversions **are not allowed**.

Images of the same subject that are combined in-camera or with software by focus stacking or exposure blending **are allowed**. Multiple images with overlapping fields of view that are taken consecutively and combined in-camera or with software (image stitching) **are allowed**.

Wildlife photography - In addition to the restrictions on Nature photography, to be eligible for any Wildlife award images must meet the following conditions:

- (a) Zoological organisms must be living free and unrestrained in a natural or adopted habitat of their own choosing.
- (b) Images of zoological organisms that have been removed from their natural habitat, are in any form of captivity or are being controlled by humans for the purpose of photography **are not** allowed
- (c) Botanical organisms **may not be removed** from their natural environment for the purpose of photography.
- (d) Images that have been staged for the purpose of photography are not allowed.
