#### **About the Artists**



#### Jan Lisiecki, pianist

Just 22, the Canadian pianist Jan Lisiecki has won international acclaim for his extraordinary interpretive maturity, distinctive sound, and poetic sensibility. The New York Times has called him "a pianist who makes every note count". Lisiecki's insightful interpretations and refined technique, give him a musical voice that belies his age. Gramophone Magazine stated "He plays pure music, given as naturally as breathing."

Born to Polish parents in Canada in 1995, Lisiecki began piano lessons at the age of five and made his concerto debut four years later. He was brought to international attention in 2010 with the release of a BBC recording of the two Chopin's piano concertos. As a result of this recording, Lisiecki signed an exclusive contract with Deutsche Grammophon in 2011, and has already recorded major works of Mozart, Chopin and Schumann for that label.

Today Jan Lisiecki appears with orchestras around the world including the Philadelphia Orchestra, the Orchestra Filarmonica della Scala in Milan, Tonhalle Orchestra Zurich, NHK Symphony Orchestra in Tokyo, Deutsches Symphonie-Orchester Berlin, the Orchestre de Paris, New York Philharmonic, BBC Symphony, Cleveland Orchestra, San Francisco Symphony Orchestra, London Philharmonic Orchestra, City of Birmingham Symphony Orchestra Rotterdam Philharmonic, Zurich Chamber Orchestra and Camerata Salzburg. In March 2013, Lisiecki substituted at short notice for Martha Argerich, performing Beethoven's Piano Concerto No. 4 in Bologna with the Orchestra Mozart under Claudio Abbado. He crowned that season with a performance of the Schumann Piano Concerto at the BBC Proms.

In recital he has appeared in London's Wigmore Hall, and at venues such as Tokyo's Suntory Hall, the Kennedy, Lincoln, and Barbican Centres, Royal Albert Hall and Rome's Academia Nazionale di Santa Cecilia.

Jan Lisiecki's 2017/18 season, includes recital tours of Europe and Asia, and orchestral debuts with the Boston Symphony, Wiener Symphoniker, and Staatskapelle Dresden, as well as his first appearance for White Rock Concerts.

Apart from his steady touring schedule, Mr. Lisiecki is involved in charity work, donating time and performances to such organizations as the David Foster Foundation, the Polish Humanitarian Organization and the Wish Upon a Star Foundation. In 2012 he was named UNICEF Ambassador to Canada having been a National Youth Representative since 2008.

#### George's Blog

How wonderful to hear the Gryphon Trio last month. They were celebrating their 25<sup>th</sup> anniversary as a touring ensemble. I think there are very few Canadian artists or groups who have performed for so many towns and cities across this country. The Gryphon is truly a Canadian Icon. There is hardly a town in Canada with an active concert programme that has not - at one time or another - presented the Trio in concert.

Part of their success lies in the hands of their management. An old friend and colleague of mine, Andrew Kwan – based in Toronto – had undertaken not only to develop the Gryphon's touring existence, but also he has assumed the responsibility of helping to build their remarkable career. Andrew is always there behind the scenes, whether it is helping them with repertoire, deciding where they should "showcase", assisting with their publicity. As I well know from sixty years of involvement with tour planning, the role of artists' management involves far more than just booking tours and signing contracts. Today's artists' manager is a combination of psychiatrist, travel agent, business manager and baby sitter. That the Gryphon Trio has flourished under Andrew's management is a good sign that touring artists and managers have come of age on the Canadian concert scene.

Most important of all, you'll find that the entire 2018-2019 season is now posted on the website.
