
Readings at Mass, Sunday 30 August 2020 – Twenty-Second Sunday in Ordinary Time

Earlier this year we had to reschedule our annual year 12 retreat, due to the restrictions in place for COVID 19. The purpose of the retreat is to provide the students an opportunity, in their final year of schooling to come together and reflect upon their relationships with one another during the senior years of their education. This has always been a moving experience for the students. The retreat provides a time and place where we can pause and consider that school is more than a place where we learn subjects.



The retreat has now been scheduled for Tuesday 1 and Wednesday 2 of September. Year 12 students will be attending the retreat led by Mr Michael Fitzpatrick. This will be a follow on retreat for those who have attended a Michael Fitzpatrick retreat in Year 9 or 10, it will not be the same. Students should be aware of the following details:

The retreat on the 1 and 2 September is compulsory

- Venue: St Patrick's Hall
- It will be run by Michael Fitzpatrick
- It is a two day retreat being held at school, in normal school time starting at 8:30 am and finishing at 3:00pm
- Students are to wear non-uniform; appropriate casual clothes with closed in shoes
- Please bring a cushion to sit on. You will be using a combination of chairs, floor and standing for the activities
- Bring a pen on the Tuesday
- Normal school tuckshop will be available for lunches

Parish Mass Update - Churches are open

Through the collaborative efforts of a number of Faith communities around Queensland, a plan for Church services has been developed with the approval of the Queensland Government. An industry COVID safe plan for places of worship is in place to minimise the risk of the spread of the disease.

Each parish has a COVID Team which is responsible for implementing the Industry Plan which Bishop Michael has agreed to for our Diocese. Thanks to members of our parish councils, liturgical teams and parishioners who make up these teams. Regular Catholic Church services have resumed in Mackay. Within the Southern Cluster of Mackay, the organisation for each of the different Churches may differ due to the physical size of the Church space. For example, numbers for each service may be restricted to less than 100 for smaller Churches, such as St Mary's. St Patrick's Church, on River Street is able to accommodate over 100 people.

To facilitate organisation and determine numbers for each mass, we have been asked to book a ticket for masses, this can be done through a booking service. Special Report: Riding the Corona Coaster

Across Victoria, students and their families are experiencing challenging times with the state being in various stages of lockdown yet again. However, this second wave of the pandemic is now also beginning to impact other areas of Australia and New Zealand. Riding this corona coaster and navigating the ups and downs of the current reality, is proving to be confronting for many people. The coronavirus has turned our lives upside down, with some students returning to remote learning and parents continuing to juggle the home environment.

On Monday 27 July, students from both the Year 11 Geography classes embarked on a field trip to a number of creeks around the Mackay region. These creeks were: Bakers Creek (two locations), Sandy Creek at Dunrock, Cabbage Creek at Grasstree Beach and Plane Creek at Sarina. Though we prepared for the potential weather challenges to our fieldwork, we were able to leave our raincoats and gumboots at home. Prior to the field trip, Mrs Rayleen Graves taught us how to use the equipment that will test the water for levels of heavy metals and minerals, turbidity, salinity and dissolved oxygen.



With the data collected on this day, students will then write a field report in which they must analyse the results and discuss reasons for the poor or healthy quality of the water.

In preparation for this adventure, students have been learning about the challenges facing places in Australia and how human impact on the natural environment can be minimised. This includes maintaining healthy waterways while minimising impacts from human activity. For example, we have found that the Thomas Borthwick and Sons Abbatoir next to Bakers Creek and the Sarina Sugar Mill next to Plane Creek, are amongst the many places to consider. Places such as these will be identified on interactive maps, created through GIS technologies.

Overall, students worked efficiently in their groups to collect meaningful data for their reports, making it a very successful field trip.
