## GOODFELLOW BLOG

Brothers and Sisters,

Last week we celebrated the Epiphany of Jesus to the Magi, and this week we celebrate another Epiphany: the Baptism of the Lord. Epiphanies communicate a mystery of God's life to us. **In the epiphany of his Baptism, the mystery is of the Trinity: the Father sends the Holy Spirit to Jesus, saying, "You are my beloved Son; with you I am well pleased."** Right away, at the beginning of his public ministry, we find out that Jesus does not act on his own authority, but is sent by the Father in the power of the Holy Spirit. He is the Son of the Father, and we should listen to him! That is the context for our Gospel this weekend.



Not only should we listen to Jesus, but his Baptism also shows us that **Jesus himself is a good listener. He knows who he is and what he is about because he listens to his Father.** When we are baptized, we share Jesus' life so that the Father also says to us in his Son, "You are my beloved daughter...You are my beloved son...With you I am well pleased." The current crisis of the breakdown of the family is part of a greater identity crisis in our culture. **We have lost sight of what it means to be mothers and fathers because we haven't truly lived from our identity as daughters and sons.** Like Jesus, we need to be good listeners, which requires prayer, to hear the Father speak to us in Christ, "You are my beloved child." Our sonship is our greatest identity, and without embracing that identity we can't do the **work** that God entrusts to us: "Jesus went about doing good and healing all those oppressed by the devil" (see Second Reading this weekend, from Acts 10:38).

In this Year of Mercy, Pope Francis offers the Church the opportunity to **be merciful like the Father.** To become merciful implies that we know what it means to be shown mercy. The Father has mercy on his prodigal sons and daughters in order to raise us to do the works of mercy. Mercy isn't a soft, hollow, or mushy form of love, but a firm (but tender), rich, and concrete love. Mercy is not concerned merely with feelings of pity, but reveals itself in concrete acts of forgiveness, relief, and charity towards others. The Church lists some awesome **works of mercy** to focus on throughout this year. They are divided into *corporal* (bodily) and *spiritual* works.

### **Corporal**

- Feed the Hungry
- Give drink to the thirsty
- Clothe the Naked
- Shelter the Homeless
- Visit the Sick
- Visit the Imprisoned
- Bury the Dead

### **Spiritual**

- Instruct the Ignorant
- Counsel the Doubtful
- Admonish the Sinner
- Bear Wrongs Patiently
- Forgive Offences Willingly
- Comfort the Afflicted
- Pray for the Living and the Dead

Devote yourself to concrete **acts of mercy** this year. As you do, you will become aware of who you are as a beloved baptized son or daughter of God. As you do this work of mercy, you may also help others experience the Father's great love for them as his sons and daughters.

## Stewardship Reflection *The Baptism of the Lord*



Today we celebrate the Solemnity of the Baptism of the Lord. This officially brings to an end the season of Christmas. You might say this is a second Epiphany. It is important to us as Catholics and Christians because it represents a second creation involving the entire Trinity.

In fact, in the Eastern Church this feast is called Theophany because God appears in three persons. Jesus the Son is baptized; the Holy Spirit descends upon Him; and God declares "You are my beloved Son; with You I am well pleased."

We recall our own Baptism on this day, because Christ's Baptism represents in many ways what occurred at our Baptism. At Christ's Baptism the Holy Spirit descended upon Him. At our Baptism the Trinity occupied our soul; Christ was declared the "Beloved Son"; at our Baptism we became a child of God. At Jesus' Baptism the heavens were opened, and at our Baptism heaven was opened to us.

On this Holy Day we need to reflect upon our own Baptismal calls — calls to live and love on this earth, a command to seek holiness, to actively be disciples of Christ, calls which can be achieved in part by embracing stewardship as a way of life. The *Catechism of the Catholic Church* (#1213) states: "Holy Baptism is the basis of the whole Christian life, the door which gives access to the other Sacraments. We are incorporated into the Church and made sharers in her mission." *Catholic Stewardship Consultants*

## Annulments, Marriage, and the First Step

Picking up the pieces of one's life after divorce is an area that can impact one's relationship with God and the Church. "What is my place in the Church? Can I go to Mass and communion? Can the Church help me heal? If I decide to marry again, what do I have to do?" The **First Step Program** helps individuals with these questions, especially those who have experienced divorce. Participants will learn about the Church's *teaching* on marriage, divorce, and remarriage, and *ministry* to the divorced and separated, hear about the annulment process and submitting a case (**no fees required**), and discover a path to healing. The schedule is as follows:

## LIFELONG FAITH FORMATION for all Generations

### Heard it in the Hallway

Our Spanish classes continue to advance! Every class starts with a prayer in Spanish as we practice our faith and the Spanish pronunciation. First through third grade students start with "*Gracias Señor.*" This prayer thanks Our Lord for different parts of our body and family. Fourth through sixth grade students start with *The Lord's Prayer*. Seventh and eighth graders start with the *Hail Mary*.

First through third grade students are improving in actively participating in class, following commands, and working on assignments. We had fun drawing monsters to practice the parts of the body and counting. We will continue with the farm animals unit and "tener" expressions to say how the animals feel based on pictures. Fourth through sixth grade students are working hard on house-related vocabulary words. They are describing and using different question/answer forms that introduce them to the use of Spanish verbs like "tener" and "haber." Since every class is built upon previous classes, we are currently working on phonetics, repeating previous lessons' vocabulary, and grammar. Seventh and eighth graders have worked on practicing different forms of the following verbs: "ser," (means to be) to say where someone is from and to describe people, places, and things; "estar," to express feelings and location; and "gustar" (to like) to express what people like to do, eat, or drink. We started working on: time, class schedules, school subjects, classroom objects, activities, and expressions of frequency. We are using dialogues, readings, and question/answer forms to use the present tense of regular verbs and some irregular ones like "to go." Students are participating actively in class. The Organic World Language method is starting to show results – students are using the language during class to produce sentences, to make statements, and to write assignments, while not being concerned with making mistakes.

He is respectful, motivated, and also encourages his classmates to show kindness. Last week, Harun made a wonderful picture with a greeting to me written in Spanish. 
