January 2, 2018 Commission Meeting

Chairman Sand called the meeting to order at 9:00 am. Present for the meeting were Commissioners Joel Hamar, John Hokana, Marke Roberts, Dean Simek and Chairman Sand. The press was not in attendance.

The Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

Commissioner Roberts motioned to approve the minutes as corrected for December 19 and December 27, 2017. Commissioner Hamar seconded. Motion carried.

Treasurer Veland joined the meeting to update Commissioners on end of year activity. Taxes collected in December was \$416,000 more than last year.

Simek made a motion to approve the fund transfers made during December 2017, which included overweight fees collected by Highway patrol transferred to the road department, transfer of the excess bond funds transferred to General as the bond is paid in full, and the transfer of the fund balance in a special road fund back to the road fund. Hokana seconded. Motion carried.

Hamar thanked Sand for his work during 2017 as Commissioner Chairman.

Hokana motioned to adjourn the final 2017 business meeting.

Auditor Sheppard called the 2018 Reorganization Meeting to order at 9:25 am. She asked for nominations for Commissioner Chairman. Simek motioned to nominate Commissioner Hamar. No other nominations were received. Commissioner Hokana asked to suspend the rules and cast a unanimous ballot for Joel Hamar as Commission Chairman. Sand seconded. Motion carried.

Chairman Hamar asked for nominations for Commission Vice Chairman. Simek nominated Marke Roberts as Vice Chairman. Hamar seconded. No other nominations were received. Sand asked to suspend all nominations and cast a unanimous ballot for Commission Roberts as Vice Chairman. Simek seconded. Motion carried.

There were no additions to the Agenda.

Clerk of Court Andi Schimke joined the meeting at 9:45.

The commissioners accepted the following Commission Portfolios.

Commissioners Dean Simek and Thor Sand – Highway Department

Commissioner John Hokana – Social Services and Health District

Commissioners Joel Hamar and Marke Roberts - Courthouse

Commissioners viewed the Board positions that are up for appointment. Sheppard will send letters to those that are coming up for renewal. An advertisement will also be put in the paper.

Commissioners reviewed the PAT agreement with Secure Software Solutions for 2018. Tax Director Flaherty joined the meeting at 10:00. Flaherty stated that the agreement had to be renewed so that ag land assessments without it. The PAT software will need to be used at least another two years. Simek made a motion to sign the agreement. Sand seconded. Motion carried.

Hokana made a motion to approve the annual software support renewal agreement with Software Innovations for 2018. Roberts seconded. Motion carried.

Hokana motioned to approve the vouchers. Simek seconded. Motion carried. There will not be any vouchers from Social Services or Health District for this meeting.

Clerk of Court Schimke updated the Commissioners on the current passport system. The new system is working well with the changes that were made in the office.

Dickey Sargent Housing Authority Director Teresa Blondo joined the meeting at 10:20. Blondo is requesting a separate phone line for their internet and phone. The speed on our network is too slow for the websites she uses. With a phone line, it would allow her to fax from her office as well. It would be better for both parties, as the client load is getting heavier the Housing Authority and Courthouse has greater requirements for reporting on the internet as well. Security for both parties is better for both parties. Housing Authority will pay all costs related to the installation of the phone line. Sand made a motion to approve the installation of internet and a phone line in the court house for Housing Authority. Simek seconded. Motion carried.

The following goals were set for 2018.

Work on handbook updates

Continue meeting with each office during personnel time

Introduce the county to the county, ie. move the meeting to another city once a year and also invite both newspapers to attend meetings to improve public awareness of activities of the county

Continue to meet with the department heads before salaries are decided at budget time Treasurer Veland presented the list of Depositories to be approved for 2018. Included on the list is Bank of North Dakota, Starion Financial of Oakes and Ellendale, First State Bank of Oakes, First Community Credit Union, Dakota Plains Credit Union, and Choice Financial of Ellendale. Roberts made a motion to accept the list of Depositories. Simek seconded. Motion carried.

The agenda for the 5 County meeting will be held at Centerfield at 4:00 on January 4th in LaMoure.

Sheppard presented a Quit Claim Deed for parcel #06812000, E 50' of Lots 3 and 4 Blk 2, Glovers Add, Glover. This is land sold at the county land sale in November. Simek made a motion to sign the quick claim deed. Roberts seconded. Motion carried.

The meeting went into recess at 11:05, and returned at 11:10.

Tax Director Flaherty joined the meeting to discuss the ag land values for 2018. The new ag land values report for 2018 were received Friday from the state of North Dakota. At full value, the cropland average per acre would need to increase 4.29% and non-cropland average per acre to increase 0.20%. Based on this information, Dickey County would need to increase their ag values in order to maintain their level of compliance with the state of North Dakota. Averages actually show that it will probably increase again next year. A motion does not need to be made today. A decision was made to wait until the beginning of February when Flaherty has a better idea of where residential and commercial values will need to be to stay in compliance with the state.

Flaherty presented information for taxing of mobile homes. In prior years, Dickey County has been at 85% of the value provided by the state of North Dakota. Flaherty asked the Commission to consider leaving the single wide at 80% and the double wide at 85%. Sand made a motion to continue all mobile homes at 85%. Hokana seconded. Motion carried. Flaherty will also check with other counties to see what other counties are doing.

Highway Superintendent Jeff Hagen joined the meeting at 11:25. The new truck has an expected delivery date of April, 2018. The total cost of the truck is \$121,726 and the snow removal equipment cost is \$73,461. Once the truck is ready at Nelson's Auto, it will be sent to Bert's Truck Equipment to install the snow equipment.

Hokana made a motion to adjourn at 12:05.

Commissioner Meeting January 16, 2018

Chairman Hamar called the meeting at 9:10. Present were Thor Sand, Marke Roberts, Dean Simek and Chairman Joel Hamar. John Hokana was not present. The media was not present.

The Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

Treasurer Gail Veland joined the meeting at 9:30.

Sand made a motion to approve the financials for December 2017. Simek seconded. Motion carried. Veland presented the 4th Quarter Pledges report. Veland noted that interest rates had gone up. Veland also stated that the first half of the payment for Social Services funding in the amount of \$332,059 was received. Simek made a motion to approve and sign the report. Roberts seconded. Motion carried

Auditor Sheppard asked to verify the cost of liquor license fees for 2018. Based on legislation in 2017, an extra fee for sale of liquor on Sundays is no longer required. Roberts made a motion to increase the beer license to \$100 and leave the retail liquor license at \$200 for the golf courses in the county. Sand seconded. Motion carried. The total cost to the golf courses will not change.

The e-mail received from LaMoure County Sheriff Bob Fernandes concerning the Barnes County jail was reviewed. The request is for one law enforcement and one commissioner to attend a meeting on February 6th at 2:00 in Valley City. A report had been received from Griggs County showing what issues had been found at the jail at an inspection. Roberts volunteered to attend the meeting.

Commissioner Hokana joined the meeting at 10:00.

The presentation made by LoadPass was discussed. It is a one stop permitting system for non-divisible loads. The county would be responsible to set the restrictions. After discussion, Hagen and Sheppard will do additional research on the information received and a comparison of current permitting comparative to using LoadPass.

The meeting recessed at 10:35 and reconvened at 10:45.

Highway Superintendent Jeff Hagen, DES/911 Coordinator Charlie Russell, and Sheriff Chris Estes joined the meeting.

Hagen stated the new truck should arrive March 22nd, and it should be ready in May when all the equipment will be installed and ready for use. Roberts requested Hagen look at Dickey County #3 at the section of road by 104th Avenue, as there is a peak coming up in the dip in the road. There may need to be a sign put up warning of the peak.

Russell informed the Commission that the second appeal to pay back FEMA funds was lost. German Township and Russell have requested help from our Senators and Representatives at the federal level. Senator Heitkamp has tried to assist, while others have not responded. Our attorney through ND IRF states that it is a conflict of interest and that they suggested a few law firms to contact. German Township Chairman Brosz selected a firm, Pearce Durick, from that list. Russell presented a letter of engagement from Pearce Durick to be signed by the Chairman. The Commission would like States Attorney Neuharth to look at the letter before it is signed.

KLJ Engineer Josh Loegering joined the meeting at 11:15. The chip seal project for 2018 bid opening is set for March 13th at 10:00 am in the court room.

Loegering presented the final payment for the mine and blend project on Dickey County #3 in the amount of \$147,408.06. Sand made a motion to approve the final payment of the project. Simek seconded. Motion carried. Loegering also presented a form letter that the project has been inspected and has been completed satisfactorily. Roberts made a motion to sign the letter. Hokana seconded. Motion carried.

Loegering presented a reimbursement request for the remaining funds for house bill 1176 to reimburse for the mine and blend project on county road 3. The remaining funds of \$75,819.50 will assist in paying of the final payment approved earlier. Hokana made a motion to sign the letter. Roberts seconded. Motion carried. Loegering presented the letter of final project certification for the funding to close out project CNOC-1112(070) on Dickey County Road 3. Sand made a motion to sign the letter. Simek seconded. Motion carried. Loegering presented the engineering consultant agreement for the next two years. The Commissioners felt the master service agreement approval should be looked at by the states attorney. Upon review of the agreement by States Attorney Gary Neuharth, Simek made a motion to sign the agreement. Roberts seconded. Motion carried.

States Attorney Gary Neuharth joined the meeting at 11:30. Neuharth reviewed the engagement letter sent by Pearce Durick. The discussion included if the cost of the attorney should still be covered by our insurance. Russell will call Mr. McQueen with ND IRF about coverage through the insurance policy and Neuharth will call Mr. Carvell with Pearce Durick about taking the case.

Commissioners asked Sheriff Estes about the prisoner bill that was not approved earlier. The prisoner should be responsible to reimburse the county for medical expenses. The voucher will be not paid until the next Commissioner meeting.

Russell and Neuharth joined the meeting. Russell stated that the insurance would cover the costs as long as the county is on the defense. Russell will forward all the paperwork he has concerning the issue to the new law firm. Neuharth approved of the law firm and the engagement letter. Sand made a motion, on the advice of the States Attorney, to sign the engagement letter. Roberts seconded. Motion carried.

Hokana made a motion to adjourn the meeting at 12:10 pm.
