INTRODUCTION:

Jeevan Jyothi School of Nursing is a Christian minority educational institution established and managed by the sisters of the congregation of Jesus, Mary & Joseph. The congregation was founded by Rev. Fr. Mathias Wolff S.J. in 1822. The medical apostolate of the congregation began in India in the year 1904 with the arrival of Seven Dutch sisters at the invitation of his grace J Alen the then Archbishop of Madras. Planted as a mustard seed, the congregation spread it's Medical Apostolate to various parts of India. At present the congregation has 4 Colleges of Nursing at Guntur, Dargamitta Hyderabad and Bangalore, Seven Schools of Nursing and two multipurpose Health Worker's Training programme.

Late Rt. Rev. Dr. Joseph Rodericks, the then Bishop of Jamshedpur, invited the Sisters of the congregation of Jesus, Mary and Joseph to establish and conduct a School of Nursing at Jamshedpur. Tata Motors Hospital, which has 404 beds established in 1969 in the Telco Town, offered to provide clinical experience to the student nurses. Thus the idea of the Jeevan Jyothi School of Nursing came into existence. The first batch of G.N.M. student nurses were recruited in January 1986. The school obtained recognition from the Bihar Nurse's Registration Council and the Indian nursing council in the year 1987. And the Mid India Board of Education (M.I.B.E) IN 1997.

The school, together with Tata Motors Hospital, provides good educational facilities and a wide scope for clinical experience to the students.

PHYLOSOPHY:

Jeevan Jyothi School of Nursing accepts the following statements of philosophy

- Man created in the image of God and the highest being in creation is unique, has intrinsic values and
 is worthy of respect His ultimate happiness lies in the union with God his Creator He has needs such
 as physical, economical, social, spiritual, psychological and educational. Meeting these needs brings
 out the best in a person.
- Nursing is a service, which relates to the whole person through a ministry of caring and nurturing. It helps individuals, families and communities to prevent illness, promote, restore health and alleviate suffering. The motto of Jeevan Jyothi "love, care and share" helps the students to motivate others to have a positive outlook on health.
- The basic course in Nursing prepares nurses for first level nursing in both the hospital and the community. Education result in the behavioral changes. Learning is promoted when intellectual inquiry, creativity, self-awareness, self-direction, maturity and responsibility are valued.
- Learning is a shared endeavor of faculty and students. The faculty is responsible for selection, direction and evaluation of learning experiences, which stimulates the intellectual and personality development of students.

OBJECTIVES:

- 1. To develop in the young women who pass through the school of nursing the necessary physical, mental, spiritual and social qualities, which enable them to take an active part in society.
- 2. To enable them to acquire the art and skill of meeting the mental physical, emotional and spiritual needs of patients.
- To develop in them an awareness of the social nature of each human person, which will enable them to see the patients as unique persons, as a part of family and as a member of society.
- 4. To awake in them a desire to help their country by placing a special emphasis on meeting health needs of the rural population and that of urban slums.
- 5. To give them the Christian orientation for the care of the sick and an understanding of the principles and practice of catholic medical ethics.
- 6. To create an academic atmosphere in the Tata Motors hospital and to improve the quality of nursing care.
- 7. To enable the student to work in mutual co-operation with medical and paramedical personnel and participate in the various programs for prevention of diseases and promotion of health in the country.
- 8. To stimulate in them a desire for further study in advanced fields of the nursing profession.

ADMISSION:

- 1. Admission is open to candidates from all parts of India provided they meet the basic requirements specified in the prospectus.
- 2. The prospectus and application form can be obtained from the principal's office, Jeevan Jyothi School of Nursing, Telco Town, Jamshedpur-831 004, Jharkhand or website www.jeevanjyothischoolofnursing.org from 22[™] September to 7[™] October 2020 on payment of Rs. 650/-by cash or DD in favour of "Jeevan Jyothi School of Nursing" payable at Telco, Jamshedpur respectively. The duly filled application forms should reach the office of the Principal latest by 7[™] October 2020. Online form will be accepted once we receive the DD of Rs. 650/-. Hall ticket will be obtained after the scrutiny of the application with Principal's signature through email by 10[™] October 2020.

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS:

- Unmarried girls between the ages of 18 and 23 years.
- Medically fit
- The candidates should have passed the pre-university/ pre degree or equivalent examination preferably Science subject, securing 40% marks on the aggregate and pass mark in English subject.
- Good knowledge of computer is essential.

PERSONAL CHARACTERISTICS:

Personal attributes of prime importance include a serious interest in working with people, maturity, motivation, self-directed learning ability and a strong sense of responsibility.

HEALTH STATUS:

Applicant must submit evidence of good health as certified by a recognized physician with a minimum height of 148 cm and weight not less than 42 kg.

STANDARDS OF CONDUCT:

Students enrolling in the school of nursing assume an obligation to conduct themselves in a manner compatible with the schools philosophy and educational purpose. It is understood that they are of good moral character and will demonstrate respect for others.

MAILING INSTRUCTION:

Completed application form with hall ticket in candidates own handwriting be returned to the principal's office with the following:

- 1. 10th & 12th or equivalent certificates along with mark sheet and pass certificate.
- 2. Conduct certificate from parish priest in case of Catholics and Christians from Pastor.
- 3. Recent conduct certificate from principal of the college last attended.
- 4. Certificate of medical fitness by a qualified physician.
- 5. A letter of application by the applicants own handwriting.
- 6. Basic computer course Certificate.
- 7. Copy of Aadhar Card.

SELECTION:

Interview will be held in 12^h & 13^h October 2020 at JEEVAN JYOTHI SCHOOL OF NURSING, Jamshedpur-4. Interview will be based on subjects of 12^h class and general knowledge and English. All candidates are required to report half an hour before commencement of interview along with a printed interview ticket which is given through email.

The principal assisted by the selection committee will scrutinize the application and those selected will be called for an interview and required to show the original certificates mentioned in the mailing instruction on interview day.

Criteria for further selection:-

- Health status of the candidates.
- Performance at interview.

The candidates will be selected in order of merit on the basis of marks obtained in 10th, 12th and interview.

COURSE OUTLINE AND MEDIUM OF INSTRUCTION:

Syllabus and the general nursing course outline as prescribed by the Indian nursing council is followed in the school of nursing and with regard to this we meet requirements fully. The medium of instruction in the school is English. Classroom and clinical lectures are given by nursing tutors, clinical instructors and doctors. Lectures on specialties will be given by specialist in the field. During training period students are assigned hospital duties for their clinical experience in various departments such as medical, surgical, pediatrics, operation theatre and other Specialties. Community nursing and family welfare work form as part of the training.

CONDUCT AND DISCIPLINE:

- 1. Students are responsible to the principal for their behavior both in and outside the school of nursing.
- 2. Students are required to maintain ethical and professional standard and behavior.
- 3. Students should make every effort to take care of the school hostel and hospital property.
- 4. Students are required to abide by the rules and regulations laid by the school of nursing, hostel and hospital authorities.

UNIFORM:

All students are required to wear uniform prescribed by the institution for the clinical and community posting.

SCHOOL & HOSTEL REGULATIONS:

- All students are directly under the direction of the Principal of Nursing School. Students must be
 punctual for all activities and are expected to comply with the rules and regulations of the
 school, the hostel and the hospital.
- Students are allowed to go out once a month for shopping prior permission is needed from hostel in-charge.
- Parents are allowed once in three months on first Sunday of March, June, Sept., Dec.
- Prior written permission from Principal should be obtained for all out goings.
- When a student is ill will inform to the Sister-in-charge see doctor and produce medical Certificate. If a student is found medically unfit she will be asked to discontinue. Any student suffering from a serious illness requiring long rest is sent to home for recuperation. In case of need the study may be extended to another academic year.
- Disciplinary action will be taken on the student for any kind of misuse of medication and wrong medication to the patients. Self-medication is strictly forbidden. If any one takes she will be dismissed immediately whatever the reason may be.
- Relatives and friends are not permitted to visit the students during duty hours. Arrival from a
 distant place will not entitle a visiting relative to see the student during her duty hours nor will
 she be called from sleep if she is on night duty.
- No student will be permitted to stay outside with relatives or friends. Permission to visit relatives and friends to attend parties, wedding and cinemas etc. should be obtained from the parents (guardians) and Principal.
- Students will wear the prescribed uniform for duty Students will be neat and tidy in their dress avoiding expensive cloths and exaggerated fashions.
- Ragging in any form is banned as it is treated as a serious offence. Any student found guilty of ragging will be suspended and / or dismissed at the discretion of the Management.
- The Sister-in-charge may check the rooms and cupboards of the student at any time without any prior notice.
- Use of tape recorder, radio or mini TV, iron, heater are forbidden in the living room.
- A simple Mobile phone will be submitted to Hostel in-charge and it will be given to the students on prescribed days.

REGISTRATION:

On completion of 3 years General Nursing and Midwifery (GNM) course, the nurses should get their names registered with the State Nursing Council, which serves as a license to practice nursing anywhere in India.

UNDERTAKING:

All students are expected to follow the rules and regulations of the school. A declaration accepting the rules and regulation agreeing to abide by them should be signed by each candidate on admission. A student who, after a written warning, continues to violate the rules is liable to be dismissed and to pay the fine specified for discontinuation of training. The deposited amount will not be refunded. In the event of any student being found negligent while on duty resulting in giving wrong treatment or administration of wrong medicines and injections and in failure to follow the principles in administering drugs, the student will be warned in writing, and for a second offence, she will be back-phased for a period of six months and in the event of a third offence, the student will be dismissed from the school. A student may be immediately dismissed for the first offence, if such an offence is of a serious nature. The school reserves the right to dismiss any one whose work, health or study, conduct is not found satisfactory during the period of training.
