The Latin Mass: Our Catholic Family Heritage

Consider this: a faithful Catholic who lived before 1970 could have gone back in time 100 years, 500 years, 1,000 years, even 1,500 years; and attending any Roman Catholic Mass in the world, would have recognized it and been able to follow along with ease.

As the Catholic Church grew from an underground movement, to eventually spread throughout the whole world; one thing that remained constant and virtually unchanged was the Traditional Latin Mass. It is staggering to think just how many generations of Catholics knew and loved this Mass. Perhaps you observe family traditions today that go back 4, 5, or more generations. But how does that compare to your Catholic Family tradition of attending the Traditional Latin Mass; millions of your Catholic family members for dozens of generations and all over the world?

What I'm getting at is this: every Catholic should be familiar with their Catholic Family Heritage; and the Traditional Latin Mass is arguably the most significant part of that Heritage. Why? Because it was known and loved by all. Not every Catholic was familiar with the writings of St. Augustine, St. Thomas Aguinas, or any number of the Doctors of the Church. Not every Catholic had the joy of worshipping at Notre Dame Cathedral or to hear the Pope speak in Saint Peter's Square. But virtually every Catholic who has ever lived, at least since the 6th Century, has experienced the Traditional Latin Mass. Nothing united Catholics throughout so many generations more than the Traditional Latin Mass.

Our identity as Roman Catholics depends on preserving our Catholic Family Heritage, which means at least having some familiarity with the Traditional Latin Mass. If you haven't already, I hope you will come and experience this Mass of the Ages, now offered every weekday at St. Anthony's (Tuesday – Saturday). We have red Latin Mass booklets to assist you; and also, several free copies of the Benedictus in the Narthex to help.






