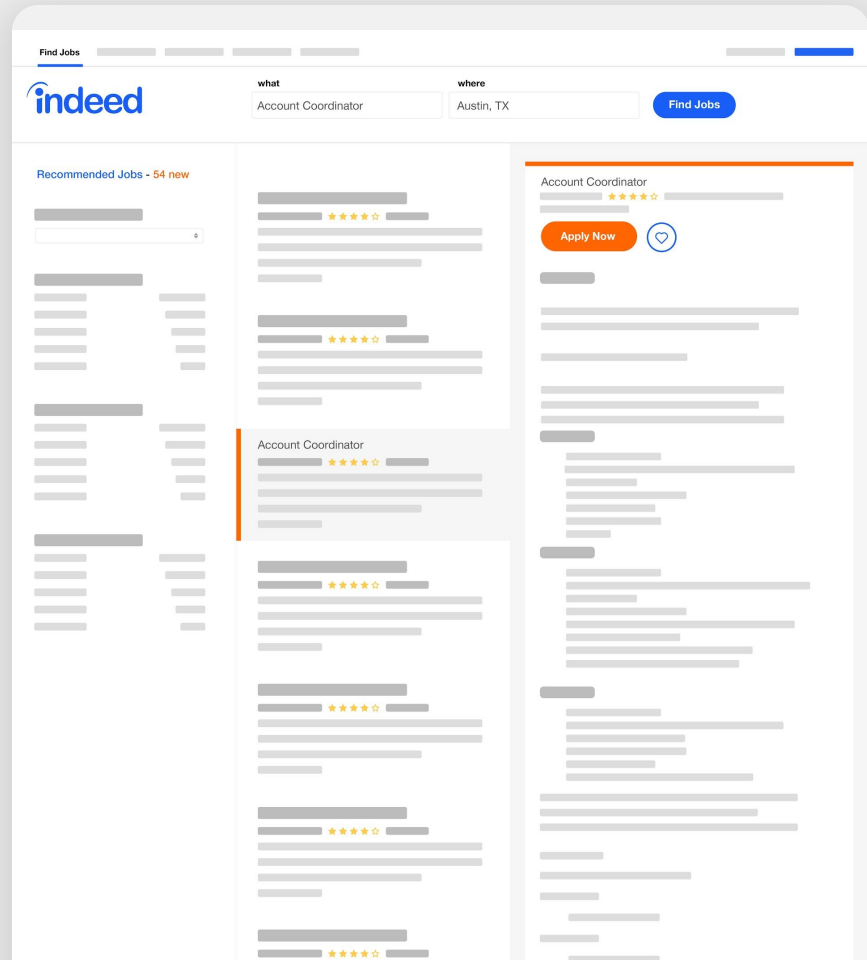

How to become a Care Coordinator

To work as a care coordinator, you need a degree in business, communication or any related medical field such as health care administration. Although most employers prefer individuals with a bachelor's degree, you can secure the job with a nurse training program or associate degree. As with other jobs, work experience is crucial for a care coordinator. Therefore, after completing your education, it is essential to seek work experience in an internship or an entry-level administrative position.

With time, you will gain experience that will make you eligible to apply for a care coordinator job. To increase the chances of getting employment, you need to ensure you get additional certifications by completing a post-bachelor certificate program. Depending on the institution, programs last somewhere from thirteen weeks to one year at most. Additional certification in patient advocacy or care coordinator can provide you with an added advantage in the job market.

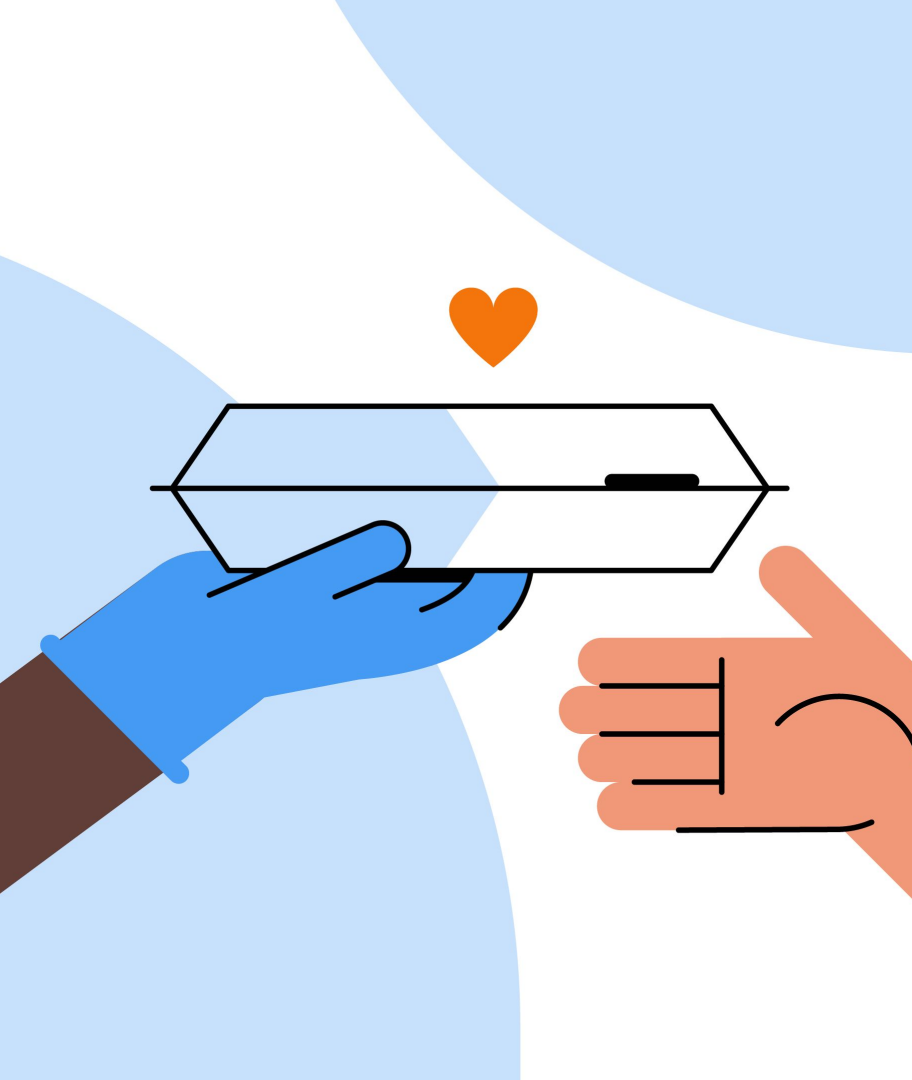

Cover Letter



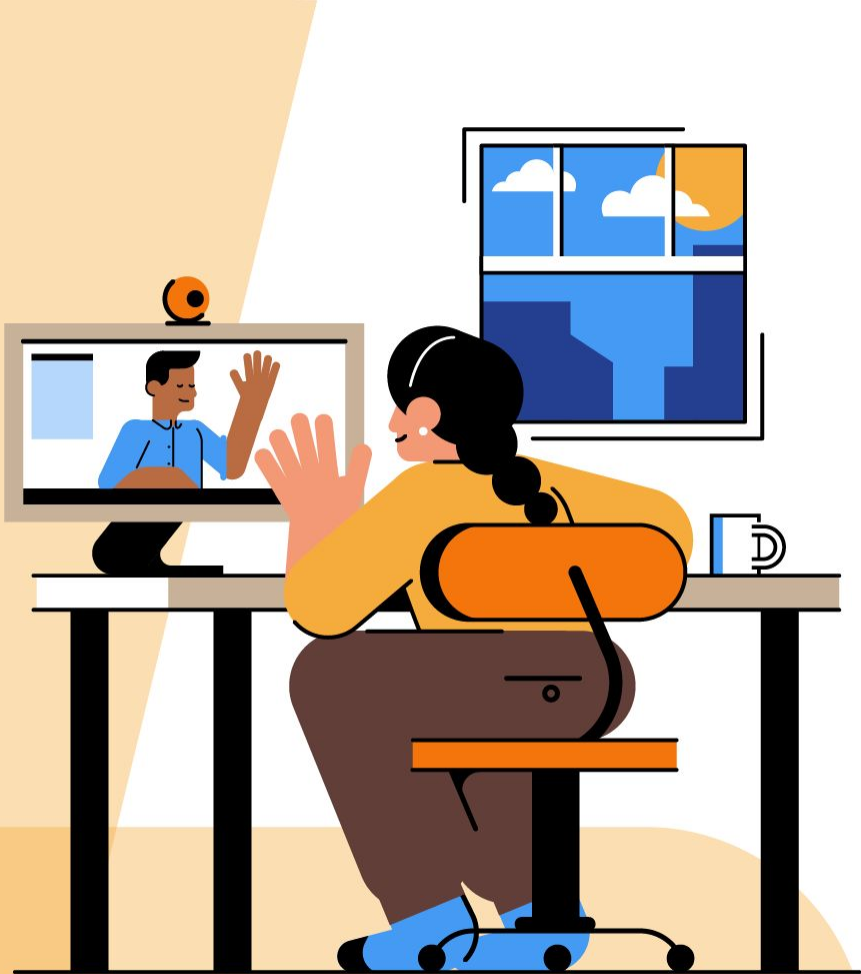
Pick your 3 strongest skills and highlight them in 1 or 2 examples.

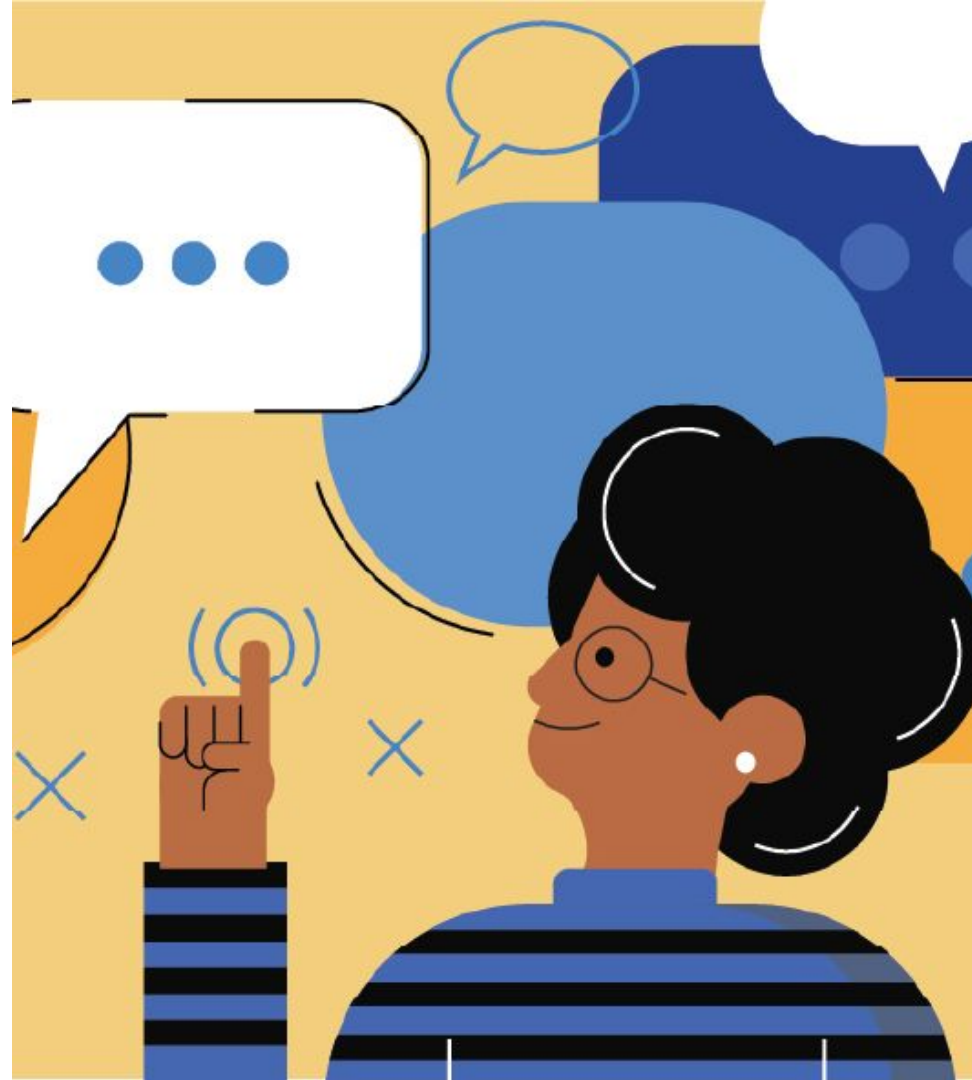


Demonstrate your soft skills

- + **Punctuality or dependability:**
Show up on time or early to the interview
- + **Active listening:**
Maintain eye contact and ask follow-up questions
- + **Effective communication:**
Speak clearly when prompted
- + **Integrity:**
Answer questions about your resume and experience honestly

Elaborate on your hard skills

- + Explain your experience and training
- + Provide a portfolio (digital or physical)
- + Effectively answer technical questions related to the work
- + Ask follow-up questions related to the work
- + Work through skills tests (if required at the interview)





Be a STAR

Situation: *What is the context of your story?*

“We were working on a six-month contract for a high-value client, when our agency merged with another, larger firm.”

Task: *What was your role?*

“It was my role to lead the transition for my group, while also communicating with our client to keep the project on track.”

Action: *What did you do?*

“I set up weekly check-ins with the client to update them on the progress of the merger...”

Results: *What happened?*

“We completed the project on time, meeting all of their specifications...”

Be a STAR

Share an example of a time when you faced a difficult problem at work. How did you solve it?

“ I was working as a **retail manager** at a department store during **prom season**. A customer purchased a dress online and had it delivered to the store. One of my associates accidentally put the dress out on the floor, where another customer immediately purchased it. Before calling the customer to let her know about the mistake, I located the same dress at another store location nearby. **I ordered it to be pressed and delivered to her home the morning of prom, along with a gift card to thank her for her understanding.** The customer was so thankful, she wrote us a **five-star review** on several review sites. ”

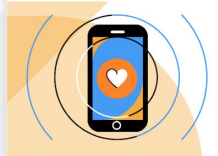



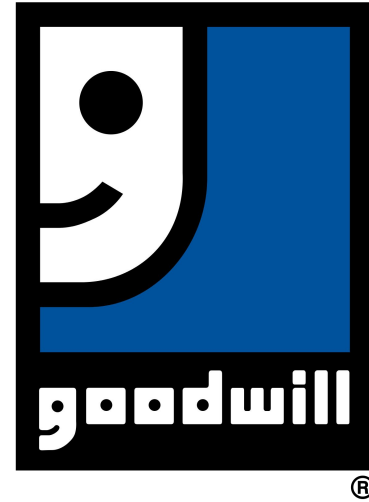
