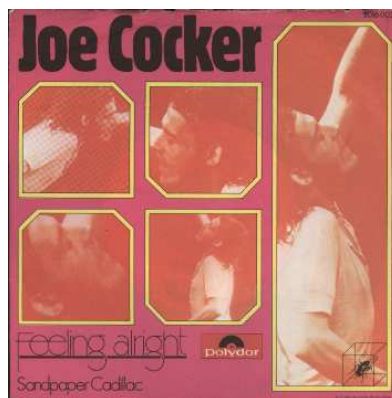

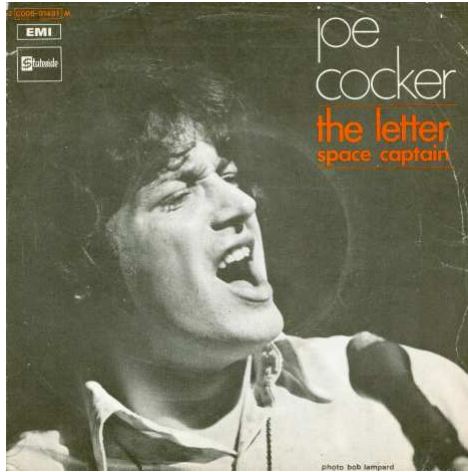
### Joe Cocker – Mad Dogs and Englishmen

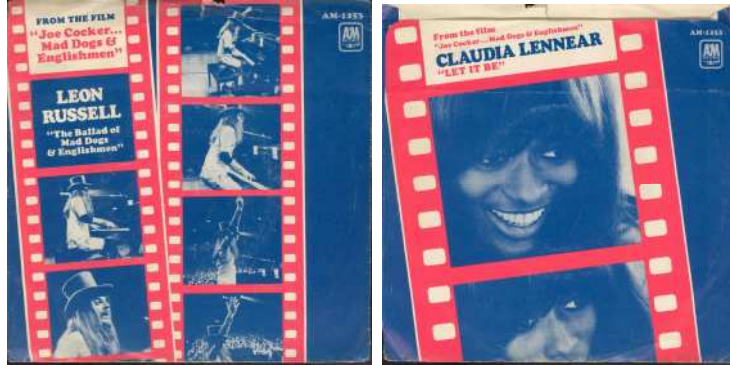
Both tracks on the above singles are from the live LP-2 – notice the “Please” in the title on the UK release. It is a shortened version (2.33) used on these singles, containing only the last half of the full track (4.30). The timings on the labels are usually wrong.

On 0328: Again both tracks from the live LP-2, but this time it’s the long (full) version (4.30) of “Give Peace a Chance”.

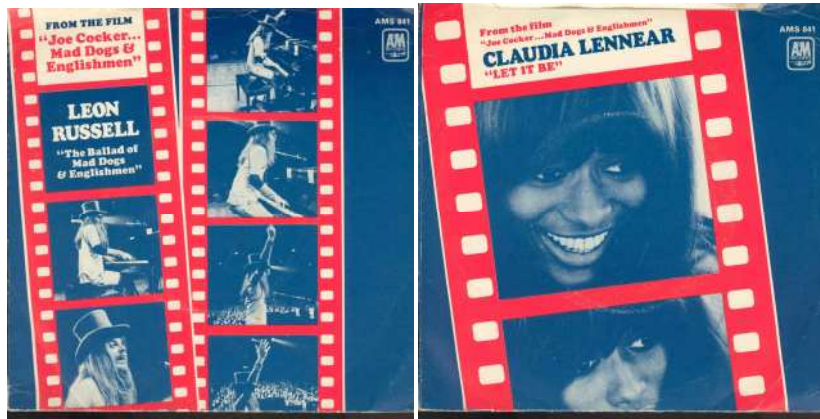

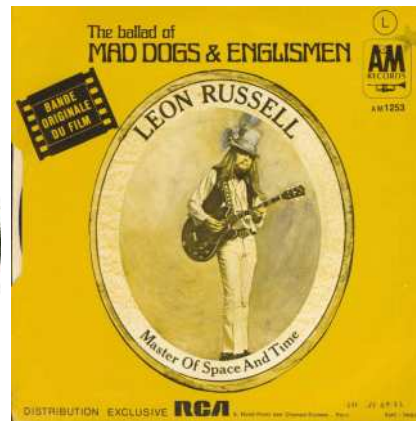
