nas lives near the ancient city of Hebron, nearly an hour outside Bethlehem. Despite the distance, for each of her three pregnancies lnas has insisted she receive all her prenatal care at Holy Family Hospital. Her husband, Abdel, is happy to accompany her to all her appointments, knowing the Hospital to be the region's best provider of maternal care.

When Inas became pregnant with her third child, she continued to travel to Holy Family Hospital often for check-ups. During a routine appointment a few days before her due date, Inas' doctor told her that her baby was in breech presentation. Inas' water broke at midnight a few nights later.



Fearing for his wife and unborn child, Abdel urged lnas to deliver at a hospital closer to home but she refused. Inas wanted to deliver in the Hospital she knew and trusted most.

Inas and Abdel arrived at
Holy Family Hospital just
after one in the morning.
As doctors and nurses
rushed her into the delivery
room, Abdel realized his wife
had made the right decision.
Their son was born just three
hours later.

mobile outreach clinic

efore Holy Family Hospital launched its Mobile Outreach Clinic in 1995, women and children in the West Bank had little access to affordable medical care. Today, the Mobile Clinic annually treats over 800 women and 1,200 children from United Nations Refugee Camps and isolated villages throughout the Bethlehem region. The Clinic brings essential obstetric, gynecological, and pediatric care to these mothers and children who would otherwise go without.



Over its 22 years of service, the Clinic has become a key fixture in the communities it serves. Many women and children rely on its weekly appearances, including mothers like Anwar.

Anwar began visiting the Mobile Clinic four years ago, after she became pregnant with her first child. She made regular visits for her prenatal appointments, and diligently followed the Clinic doctor's direction on how to stay healthy during her pregnancy.

It was after her very first appointment that she knew she wanted to deliver at Holy Family Hospital.

"I saw how well the doctors and nurses treated us at the Mobile Clinic. I knew they would also treat me well when it came time for my delivery," she says.

Just a few months later, she delivered a healthy baby boy, Ali, at Holy Family Hospital.

As her son grew, Anwar began taking him to the Mobile Clinic pediatrician for regular check-ups because she could not afford to travel into Bethlehem to visit a specialist.

Through her second and third pregnancies, Anwar was always a regular at the Clinic. Hamid, her husband, says he owes the health of his family to the Mobile Clinic's high-quality care.



Hamid says ,"Every Tuesday my wife visits the Clinic. She is so happy to have doctors who can help answer her questions. She and our babies are cared for in the same place, making it very easy for her. I am happy knowing that my family is healthy and that they get the best care."


the INNKEEPER'S corner

oly Family Hospital is a proud, longtime partner of Bethlehem University's nursing and midwifery programs. These top-tier programs have succeeded in opening up new employment opportunities for Palestinian men and women.



This semester, four fourth-year nursing students began an internship at Holy Family Hospital. Over the next few months, they will rotate between the labor ward, postnatal ward, and emergency room, shadowing our experienced nurses, many of whom also graduated from Bethlehem University.

Though the internship has been challenging at times, nursing student Waleed Bannoura (pictured, left) feels like he has already gained invaluable experience.

"As a nurse, it's important to be able to be calm in stressful situations, but that isn't something that I can learn in a classroom," Waleed says. "The nurses I am working with have taught me how to be calm, how to help a frightened mother when she is feeling most vulnerable."

As the second largest employer in Bethlehem, Holy Family Hospital plays a crucial stabilizing role in the community, providing jobs to 170 Palestinian families and creating employment opportunities for women in an area where few exist. All four nursing students aspire to work at Holy Family Hospital after graduation.

"I admire how the doctors and nurses treat the patients here. Everyone is so compassionate and kind, and wants to make the new mothers and infants as comfortable as possible," Waleed says.

Diabetes Clinic

hawla and her husband, Sami, celebrated twenty years of marriage in the postnatal ward of Holy Family Hospital. On the day of their anniversary, Khawla was recovering from the delivery of their newest daughter, Maria.

"I have delivered all my children at Holy Family Hospital," Khawla said. "I always come back here because this is the best hospital for mothers and babies."

Khawla and Sami reside with their five children in Handazeh, a small village on the outskirts of Bethlehem. Eight months into her pregnancy, Khalwa was diagnosed for the first time with gestational diabetes. Holy Family Hospital's Diabetes Clinic identified the condition during a routine prenatal exam.

Like any mother hearing such a diagnosis, Khawla worried for her unborn child. Her pregnancy was now considered high-risk, and she was nearly two decades older than she was during her first pregnancy. Sami confessed that he did not think their family could pay the added healthcare costs.



Doctors assured Khalwa and Sami that Holy Family Hospital's Diabetes Clinic would be able to mitigate these new health risks at a cost that their family could easily afford. Khalwa spent two nights at the Hospital for monitoring and had regular check-ups at the Clinic throughout the last month of her pregnancy.

After her delivery, baby Maria was immediately admitted to the Neonatal Intensive Care Unit for observation. Miraculously, she showed no complications and was discharged after only two days.

"I am so grateful to the Diabetes Clinic that Maria is healthy. The doctors monitored me and my baby after I was diagnosed and made sure we were both well."

Khawla and Sami say their twentieth anniversary was their best yet.

A BEACON OF hope

Salim is the warm, welcoming face in Holy Family
Hospital's nursery. He has been hearing the first cry of
newborns since 1982, when he started as a pediatrician.
Today, Dr. Salim is retired from his private practice, but he continues
to work at Holy Family Hospital part-time. He cannot bear to fully retire
and be away from the newborns he loves so dearly.



Born in Bethlehem to a hotel owner and a stay-at-home mother, Dr.
Salim grew up in a busy household of five children. He loved science as a child and would often spend time in his parents' hotel chatting with guests, one of whom would one day become his medical mentor.

Dr. Salim's mentor was a well-known pediatrician from Palestine who would visit Bethlehem often, always asking young Salim about

his studies and academic life. After high school, Dr. Salim enrolled in medical school in St. Petersburg. When his mentor died unexpectedly during Dr. Salim's first year, he was driven to work harder. Today, he dedicates his pediatric vocation to the memory of his mentor.

Boasting a stellar academic career, including a postdoctoral fellowship in France, Dr. Salim had job opportunities at some of the top pediatric facilities in the world. Instead, he chose to return to Bethlehem to care for the underserved children in his hometown.

Dr. Salim was born with achondroplasia, a form of short-limbed dwarfism, but his family never allowed the disability to hold him back. His outsized, extroverted personality has allowed him to excel in his career as a well-loved and respected pediatrician. He has worked extensively with children with cerebral palsy, hoping to impart to children with disabilities a message of hope and transcendence beyond the physical.

More than anything, Dr. Salim is attracted to the human side of medicine. He loves reassuring new parents and teaching them how to care for their growing children. Throughout his career, he has been guided by a conviction that medicine is not merely a job, but a vocation in the service to humanity.

"Other fields pay higher salaries," he says, "but my heart is with the newborns and families at Holy Family Hospital." Thank you Dr. Salim!
