

Matthew 1:1, "This is the genealogy of Jesus the Messiah the son of David, the son of Abraham."

Luke 1:3-4 (NLT), "Having carefully investigated everything from the beginning, I also have decided to write a careful account for you, most honorable Theophilus, so you can be certain of the truth of everything you were taught."

James Irwin, "There is one thing better than man walking on the moon, and that is God walking on the earth."

Observation #1: Before the world began...God had a PLAN to rescue mankind

Isaiah 7:14, "Therefore the Lord Himself will give you a sign: Behold, a virgin will be with child and bear a son, and she will call His name Immanuel."

Isaiah 53:6 (NCV), "The Lord has put on him the punishment for all the evil we have done."

Luke 1:30-31 (CEV), "Then the angel told Mary, 'Don't be afraid! God is pleased with you, and you will have a son. His name will be Jesus."

Matthew 1:21, "She will give birth to a son, and you are to give him the name Jesus, because He will save His people from their sins."

Sermon Outline

2 Corinthians 5:21 (NCV), "Christ had no sin, but God made him become sin so that in Christ we could become right with God."
Observation #2: Not only did God have a PLAN, He sealed it with His PROMISE that it would be fulfilled and God always keeps His PROMISES
Micah 5:2 (MSG), "But you, Bethlehem, David's country, the runt of the litter—from you will come the leader who will shepherd-rule Israel. He'll be no upstart, no pretender. His family tree is ancient and distinguished."
Isaiah 9:6 (NCV), "A child has been born to us; God has given a son to us. He will be responsible for leading the people. His name will be Wonderful Counselor, Powerful God, Father Who Lives Forever, Prince of Peace."
Isaiah 53:5 (CEV), "But he was pierced for our rebellion, crushed for our sins. He was beaten so we could be whole. He was whipped so we could be healed."
Psalm 22:16-18 (NLT), "My enemies surround me like a pack of dogs; an evil gang closes in on me. They have pierced my hands and feet. I can count all my bones. My enemies stare at me an gloat. They divide my garments among themselves and throw dice for my clothing."
Reflection
2 Corinthians 9:15, "Thanks be to God for his indescribable gift!"
Romans 3:23-25 (NCV), "Everyone has sinned and fallen short of God's glorious standard, and all need to be made right with God by his grace, which is a free gift. They need to be made free from sin through Jesus Christ. God sent him to die in our place to take away our sins. We receive forgiveness through faith in the blood of Jesus' death."
