

Judaism: Lost in America

Last month, the Pew Research Center's Religion & Public Life Project released the first major survey of American Jews in more than 10 years. It found a significant rise in those who are not religious, who marry outside the faith and who are not raising their children Jewish — resulting in "rapid assimilation that is sweeping through" both Conservative and Reform Judaism.

The intermarriage rate has reached an astounding 71 percent for non-Orthodox Jews.

Two-thirds of Jews do not belong to a synagogue, one-fourth do not believe in God and one-third had a Christmas tree in their home last year, according to the report in The New York Times.

Jews who do not define themselves as religious tend not to raise their children Jewish, so this secular trend "has serious consequences for ...'Jewish continuity.' Of the "Jews of no religion" who have children at home, twothirds are not raising their children Jewish in any way while 93% of those who identified as "Jews with religion" said they are raising their children to have a Jewish identity.

I have written about intermarriage in the past and I want to reinforce my belief that non-Jewish spouses can bring a level of integrity and spirituality to their families and to our congregation. So I do not want this column to be interpreted in any way as denigrating interfaith couples. This is simply to acknowledge that in order to preserve Judaism, especially progressive Judaism, we need to foster a generation of Jewish children who will grow up to be enthusiastic participants in a Jewish lifestyle.

Our people's "arrival" in American society has a consequence that our grandparents damned, our parents denied but which we take as a given. Many Jews today lament this evaporation of Jewish identity, observing that we are a three-millennium-old people lured away from our historic character by the baubles of consumerism.

We are in crisis. Judaism has become not just secondary but marginal.

Our membership in a Conservative synagogue is acknowledgment that Judaism is important to us. Yet, many feel anxious about how much Judaism we are instilling in our children. The survey highlights the reality that there is a direct correlation between ritual observance and Jewish continuity – that, in effect, our kids are not going to be Jewish because they attend Hebrew School but because Judaism is alive in their home.

The Pew study offers incontrovertible proof that parents who light Shabbat candles on Friday night and make Kiddush as a family at Friday evening dinner are much more likely to celebrate their grandchildren's Bar or Bat Mitzvahs than those who do not.

The challenges we are facing belong to all of us in the American Jewish community. We're not going to build Jews simply by providing formal education. Unless we demonstrate by deed that Judaism is alive with energy, passion and action, the Judaism that we cherish will rapidly wither.





My Fellow Congregants:

Initially, I would like to extend my thanks for the many compliments that I have received for the recently completed High Holy Day services. I thank and congratulate Francine Katz, Eve Fields and Jon Cohen for the excellent organization and coordination of those services.

Following up on my Kol Nidre appeal last month, the Finance Committee presented a proposed budget at the September Special Board Meeting. The budget was met with significant concern and comment by members of the Congregation who felt that more emphasis should be placed on expense reduction rather than the use of additional debt. It was suggested that a

special committee be formed to explore that concept. Towards that end I have created an Emergency Budget Task Force, which will review the budget and make recommendations to the board as to possible budget reduction scenarios. Their work should be completed in thirty to forty five days, at which time the Finance Committee will incorporate their findings into a revised proposed budget, which will be presented to the Board and Congregation for approval. As a result of the above, any dues increase will be deferred until the third quarter.

With the conclusion of the High Holy Days, the Synagogue is abuzz with activity. During the day our Nursery School children bring life to the building. As we embark on our journey to restore the Nursery School to its former economic vigor, I have created a special Nursery School Revitalization Committee to plan its' transformation into a full day Nursery School. Stay tuned for further developments.

In the afternoon and early evening the building is alive with the students in our Religious School and our growing Hebrew High School.

Nighttime brings yet additional activity. As I write this article, our new Adult Singles group is meeting in the Library and the initial meeting of our reconstituted Golf Committee is taking place down the hall. Later this week our Young Couples Club will meet as well.

As Thanksgiving and Chanukah approach I hope that each of you receives gifts that have meaning and enjoy the opportunity to say thank you for them.

KILLER POTATO LATKES

CONTRIBUTED BY ANDREW ZIMMERN

"These Jewish potato pancakes are so good that posting the recipe alone is a mitzvah (blessing) of the highest order. Bubbelah, you should always trust me with this stuff." from Andrew Zimmern's Kitchen Adventures

1 pound Yukon Gold potatoes, peeled and cut into 2-inch chunks

Sea salt

2 pounds baking potatoes

- 1 large onion, finely diced
- 2 large eggs, lightly beaten
- 1 cup matzo meal
- 1/2 teaspoon freshly ground white pepper
- Vegetable oil, for frying
- Applesauce, crème fraîche, smoked salmon, salmon roe and dill sprigs, for serving



In a medium saucepan, cover the Yukon Gold potatoes with cool water, season generously with salt and bring to a boil. Cook the potatoes until tender, about 15 minutes. Drain well and immediately pass the potatoes through a ricer into a large bowl.

Working quickly, peel and grate the baking potatoes on the large holes of a box grater into a medium bowl. Press with a clean kitchen towel to remove excess moisture. Add half of the grated potatoes to the riced potatoes.

Transfer the remaining grated potatoes to the bowl of a food processor. Add the onion and pulse until the potatoes and onions are very finely chopped. Transfer to a fine-mesh sieve and press with the back of a spoon to extract as much liquid as possible. Add the potato-onion mixture to the large bowl. Stir in the eggs, matzo meal, white pepper and 2 teaspoons of salt.

In a large, heavy skillet, heat 1/4 inch of oil until shimmering. Working in 3 batches, spoon 1/4 cup of the potato mixture into the oil for each latke; press slightly to flatten. Fry over moderate heat, turning once, until the latkes are golden and crisp on both sides, about 7 minutes. Drain the latkes on a paper towel-lined baking sheet and sprinkle lightly with salt. Serve with applesauce, crème fraîche, smoked salmon, salmon roe and dill.

The fried latkes can be kept at room temperature for up to 4 hours. Reheat them on a baking sheet in a 375° oven for about 5 minutes, or until warmed through and crisp.


