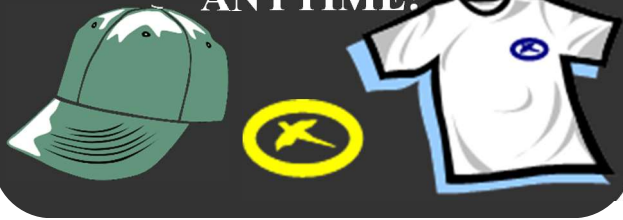

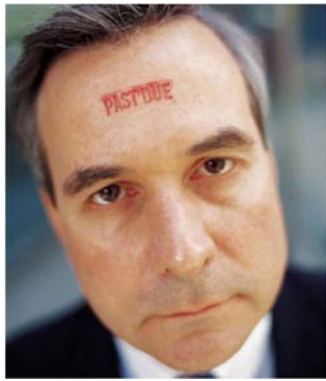

On June 8th, a motion made by Larry Gray and seconded by Sam Mullins, was voted on by secret ballot to have me removed from the board of directors. The vote passed by a 7 to 7 tie decided by the Chairman of the Board.

Most every event or activity that this club has put on over the term of my membership I gladly volunteered my time and efforts to help in any way I could even if it meant missing my grandson's baseball game or other family gatherings.

Now this board has seen fit not to accept my wish to rescind my request for resignation and voted to have me removed. I am now willing to accept that decision. I feel if I were placed back on the board with some of its' current membership, that my ability to perform the job the members hired me to do would be at the very least more difficult than I am willing to give at this time. With all of the trouble that we have getting members to volunteer and new members to join I feel that it is very sad that we have a Board in place that is so willing and quick to throw one away.
