Greetings Caldwell Church family and friends.

I hope all is well with you as summer offers great opportunities to enjoy life, amidst the chores and times of recreation; take time to enjoy the blessings God provides.

How we live life, shapes us, it makes us who we are: how we see ourselves, and how we see others. When we live with regrets, fears and worries; we sometimes lose the joy in life, and that can give us a bad attitude, make us cranky, and mad at the world, upset with others, and begin to forget to be thankful for all God's blessings.

In Matthew and Luke's Gospels, we are given *The Beatitudes: "the blessed are ..."*; they are a part of Jesus' Sermon on the Mount, or as Luke describes it the plain. Whither it was a mount or a plain; Jesus taught the people lesson on living a life pleasing to God. There are several things Jesus talked about; which I mentioned during the Lenten season, as Spiritual Practices: *Giving, Prayer, and Fasting*;

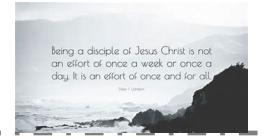
These three points help to keep us focused on who God is, and how we are to live. *First*, **Give**, we need to be grateful. God blesses us, so we can give to help bless others. Be generous. *Second*, **Pray**, learn to pray, to talk to God, and listen for God to speak to you. Listen to the Lord's voice each day; it will strengthen your relationship with God and other believers. *It's in the Sermon, that the disciple's asked Jesus to teach them to pray. He says, pray this way: "Our Father. Who is in heaven....", you probably know the rest. The Third point is Fasting: going without some basics and luxuries, so to learn to trust God more. (Fasting seems to be the most difficult for most people to practice; (I know it's hard for me; if not for you.) These three points are followed with The Beatitudes.*

I'm not sure if being "blessed" comes during, or after we have developed Spiritual Practices; but I have experienced God's presence and blessing through them. As followers of Jesus, we should be intentional about how we live our lives; it not always easy, but it is necessary to grow as a disciple of Jesus Christ.

This coming Sunday, I will begin a series of messages focusing on Wesleyan <u>Guidelines for Disciple-ship:</u> Which focus on our Personal and Public practices which help us grow in faith. How our devotional life: scripture and spiritual readings, enhances our worship. How being intentional about showing compassion to those in need, by showing grace and mercy to people who need the Lord, really changes lives; we all need to walk closer to the Lord. I will continue to speak to the topic of being a disciple for Jesus.

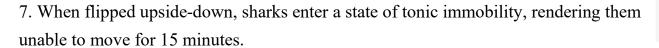

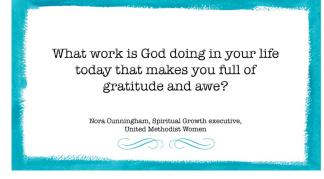

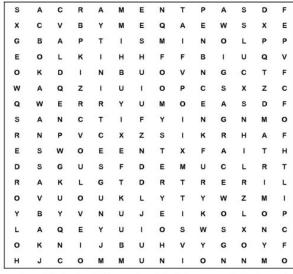
