Vision 2025

God's Global Barnyard

LIFT continues its commitment to act as one Body in Christ within the Fremont community. The caring ministry of LIFT 'lifts' up during the months of May and June God's Global Barnyard, one of the Good Gifts ministries of the ELCA. World hunger reaches to all corners of the world.

You've heard it said, "Give your neighbor a fish, they can eat for a day. Give your neighbor a community of fish and training in good business economics, they can eat for a lifetime". That is the goal of Global Barnyard.

Besides fish providing healthy meals and income, a variety of other animals support families around the world:

- 1. Sheep (\$125.00) provide wool for warmth and clothing, as well as milk.
- 2. Honey Bees (\$20) Beeswax is used to make handcrafted soaps and candles, and honey and pollen can be sold at the market as well.
- 3. Chicks,(\$10 for 10) when they are just a few months old begin laying eggs providing more nutritious meals. They also allow families to start a small business.
- 4. Goats (\$50) are especially valuable to families living in hot, dry climates, providing fresh milk which can be used to make healthy dairy products.
- Ducks (\$20) are the best natural pesticide around and produce protein-rich eggs.

These along with cows (\$500 or \$50 a share), pigs (\$30) and alpacas can provide families with a fresh start and a means to escape the cycle of hunger and poverty for good. Please prayfully consider joining in our efforts in eradicating world hunger.

Kingdom of God: (a.k.a. Reign of God) A time that hasn't happened yet but has already begun; A place that doesn't exist yet but where you already live

Q&AWITH THE ENDOWMENT BOARD

Q: Do I need a Will?

A: Without a will, state law dictates who will receive your assets and who will manage your estate. The state's plan for assets may not include all people you would like to benefit and definitely will not include gifts to your church and other charities. A will also allows you to appoint a guardian for your minor children, choose a representative to carry our your wishes, and decide the final destination of your estate assets.

Making a charitable bequest (i.e. giving assets to your church or other charities through a will) is the simplest way to make a planned gift. You can specify in your will the amount or percentage of assets that are to pass to the church. Your estate will receive an estate tax deduction for the bequest. There is no limit on the amount of the charitable gift made by bequest or on the amount that can be deducted for estate tax purposes.

As an alternative to a specific dollar amount or a percentage bequest, you may wish to designate the church as the "residual beneficiary" of the estate. After children, friends and others have received specific bequests, the church as a "residual beneficiary" will receive what is left in the estate.

To be sure that you have an enforceable will that accomplishes your objectives, it is best to work with an experienced estate planning attorney.




