Dear Friends,

Today we celebrate the great feast of the Body and Blood of Christ, the Eucharist, proclaimed by the Church as "the source and summit of our lives." As we read in the Gospel of Mark today, Jesus, at the Last Supper, on the night before He died, offered his own body to be shared, as well as his own blood, for the salvation of the world.

Every time we gather for Mass, we celebrate in thanksgiving (which is the meaning of the word Eucharist), Jesus' gift of Himself to us. During the Eucharistic Prayer, through the power of the Holy Spirit and words of consecration, the bread and wine become the true Body and Blood of Jesus, which are also the same body and blood given up and poured out on the cross. They are not signs, not symbols, but Christ's Real Presence. Our participation in the Eucharist is participation in Jesus' redemptive self-giving at Calvary. Our reception of the Eucharist is participation in both the Last Supper and the sacrifice on the cross.

Partaking of the Eucharist unites us with one another in community, just as it did for the disciples with Jesus at the Last Supper, and it strengthens us on our journey to the kingdom. Like all seven sacraments, it is a sign that God is with us on our pilgrimage. Uniting us, then, the Eucharist calls to reach out to others. It cannot be simply about "getting" Communion; it is being in communion with Jesus and with others who are also with Him.

One of my favorite quotes on the Eucharist is from St. Augustine who said "Christian, believe what you see, see what you believe and become what you are: the Body of Christ." When we say "Amen", we are saying "Yes! I believe this is the Body and Blood of Christ," and we are saying, "Yes, I will be the body of Christ for others."

"If you, therefore, are Christ's body and members, it is your own mystery that is placed on the Lord's table! It is your own mystery that you are receiving! You are saying 'Amen' to what you are: your response is a personal signature, affirming your faith. When you hear 'The Body of Christ', you reply 'Amen.' Be a member of Christ's body, then, so that your 'Amen' may ring true!"
(St. Augustine, Sermon 272)

Lifting of the Dispensation from the Obligation to Attend Mass

“We, the Catholic Bishops of the Province of Baltimore and the Archdiocese of Washington, give thanks to Almighty God for the progress our country has made in curbing the coronavirus pandemic. The average number of new cases of COVID-19 continues to decline due to the observance of safety protocols and the increase of the availability of the vaccine. At this time, many places in our region are enjoying a return to some sense of normalcy.

Therefore, we are lifting the dispensation of the Sunday and Holy Days Mass obligation in the Archdiocese of Baltimore, the Archdiocese of Washington, and the Dioceses of Arlington, Richmond, Wheeling-Charleston, and Wilmington and reinstating that obligation beginning on Saturday, June 26, 2021 and Sunday, June 27, 2021. We welcome and encourage the Faithful to return to full in-person participation of the Sunday Eucharist, the source and summit of our Catholic faith (cf. Code of Canon Law, canon 1246-1247 and Catechism of the Catholic Church, n. 2180).

This obligation does not apply to those who are ill; those who have reason to believe that they were recently exposed to the coronavirus, another serious or contagious illness; those who are confined to their home, a hospital, or nursing facility; or those with serious underlying health conditions. One should consult his or her local pastor if questions arise about the obligation to attend Mass (Canon 1245 and the Catechism of the Catholic Church n. 2181).

Safety protocols and other liturgical directives in each diocese remain in effect until modified or revoked by the respective Diocesan Bishop.

Let us continue to be united in prayer for one another and for an end to the global pandemic.”

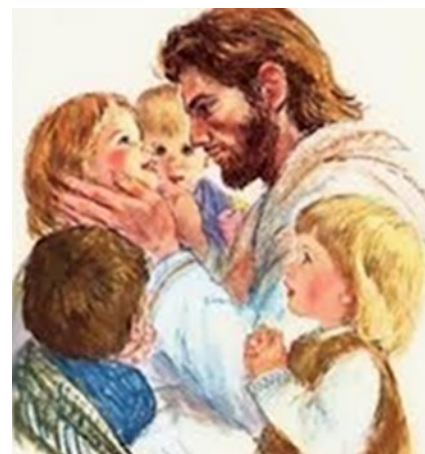

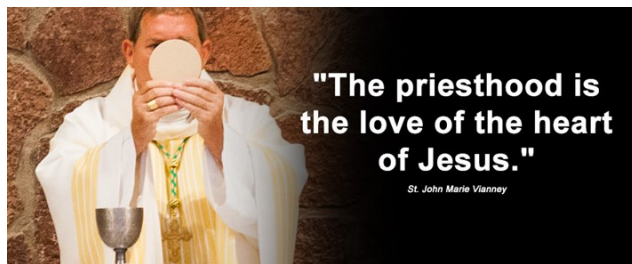


