

GOSPEL MEDITATION

As our world faces so much turmoil and change, it is now more important than ever to remember who God is, who we are and where we are going. It is easy to get distracted and lose focus, especially when we are being pulled in so many directions. We can not only lose sight of God but one another.

Maintaining our well developed and mature relationships with God and one another is essential to continuing to live, healthy, happy, and focused lives. In a message to young people, Pope Benedict XVI said, "the happiness you are seeking, the happiness you have a right to enjoy has a name and a face: it is Jesus of Nazareth, hidden in the Eucharist." What is true for those who are younger is even truer for those who are older. Regardless of how the particulars of life change over time, human beings are still hard-wired to seek the fullness of life and happiness. How we embark on this journey and what we choose along the way will indicate whether we meet success.

There is so much brokenness and pain in our world. Many people are lost, feeling lonely, anxious, marginalized, victimized, isolated, oppressed, and abused. Every time we receive the Body of Christ, we have an opportunity to become what we eat. The power and presence of Christ in the Eucharist becomes present in us and effects change in ourselves and in the lives of those we meet. We are given the grace to become temples of justice and peace, carrying God's sacred Presence within us wherever we go. Our faith community is ignited with the fire of God's love and stands out as a beacon of hope in a world that is lost. This is the only way we can discover peace-filled resolutions to violence and create innovative solutions to what is fueling its need in the first place. True happiness, for the young and old alike, becomes an obtainable goal.

St. John Maria Vianney says it so well. "There is nothing so great as the Eucharist. If God had something more precious, he would have given it to us." Only the Eucharist has the ability to connect, sustain, strengthen, and properly orient us, not only on the road of this life but the road to life eternal. Knowing this, when life gets challenging, unsettling, and difficult, we can rely on and cling to this gift we have in the Paul Presence of Christ. This actual encounter with Cod

have in the Real Presence of Christ. This actual encounter with God celebrates God's unconditional love for us and grounds us to the truth of who we are in a way nothing else is able to do. Because through the Eucharist we really do become the Body of Christ, we are also bonded together in a most perfect way to one another as that Body. 

Vivat Jesus! from all at Knights of Columbus Council 4188 in Clawson. Council 4188 represents three parishes: Guardian Angels in Clawson and Christ Our Light and Saint Elizabeth Ann Seton, both located in Troy.

Covid has not stopped the Knights from doing the Lord's work. It has been a very busy, fun, hardworking April and May for the Council 4188.

It started with seven weeks of a successful and popular drive thru **Fish Fry during Lent**. 2,327 meals were sold without anyone leaving their vehicle. \$7,288 was donated to two separate autism charities and a veteran's support group.

Next was the **Tootsie Roll Drive** for the mentally impaired, a statewide, annual event held Palm Sunday weekend. \$8,180 was donated by YOU after Mass, at the grocery store, bakery, hardware store and catholic credit union. Proceeds were donated to four organizations assisting the mentally impaired.

While all this was going on the Knights hosted the annual Knights of Columbus **State District Free Throw Contest** for boys and girls ages 8-14 at Guardian Angels. What a fun event! Winners in each category went on to compete in regionals. Five made it to the State Finals in Mt. Pleasant. I am proud to say we have two state champs! Leah McCulloch 12-year-old girls and Hannah Saunders 13-year-old girls.

Then there was the **bottle and can drive**. Again, overwhelming support from the community. \$2,000 was donated to "Cans for Seminarians", a Michigan Knights of Columbus program. If I never see another recycling center it won't be too soon! Truly, for the many knights who received the bottle and can donations and returned them to the store, it was a labor of love.

Behind the closed doors of the hall a **fabulous transformation** was taking place. Several brother Knights tore down the aged bar area in the 5,000 sq. ft. hall and installed new flooring, cabinets and bar. When I saw the finished project, I was blown away! WOW! We are **open for business** for your wedding receptions, birthday parties and celebrations.

The icing on the cake was the 2nd Annual Gleaners/Knights of Columbus Virtual Food Drive concluding on May 21st. \$7,500 was raised by donations from brother Knights, parishioners, friends and family and the community. A 31% increase over \$5,707 last year! Each dollar is matched 1:1 by Gleaner's benefactors. Each \$1 provides three meals. That's 45,000 meals!

Council 4188 has 307 members. Ages range from 18 to 103 with all sorts of life stories, experiences, jobs and careers, successes and struggles. What we all have in common is a love for Jesus Christ and the Catholic Church. 



SILENCE BEFORE MASS: A GENTLE REMINDER

A few years ago, Pope Francis called out the common habit of chatting with people before Mass, stressing that this is a time for silent prayer, when we prepare our hearts for an encounter with the Lord.

"When we go to Mass, maybe we arrive five minutes before, and we start to chitchat with those in front of us," the Pope said. However, "it is not a moment for chitchat."

"It is a moment of silence for preparing ourselves for dialogue, a time for the heart to collect itself in order to prepare for the encounter with Jesus," he said, adding that "silence is so important."

MASS INTENTIONS AND CANDLES

The Parish Office is able to schedule Mass Intentions and sell candles. Our office hours are Monday –Thursday from 9:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. We are closed for lunch from 12:00 p.m. to 1:00 p.m. Please call the office at 248-879-1310 prior to your visit in order that we may plan for your arrival. If you come to the office, a mask is required. If you are continuing your stay at home quarantine, and would like to schedule with the parish secretary over the phone, please call Lynn for assistance and instructions.

OUR PARISH & CATHOLIC LIFE

The general dispensation from the obligation to attend Mass on Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation expired on March 13.

While the general dispensation is removed, there are specific instances where the dispensation will continue, as well as those circumstances where there is no obligation in the first place. One does <u>not</u> have an obligation to attend Mass on Sunday <u>in the following circumstances</u>:

- 1. You are ill or your health condition would be significantly compromised if you were to contract a communicable illness (i.e., you have underlying conditions or are in a high-risk category). <u>Please use</u> the dispensation and do not attend Mass.
- 2. You exhibit flu-like symptoms. <u>Please use the</u> dispensation and do not attend Mass.
- 3. You have good reason to think you might be asymptomatic of a contagious illness (e.g., you were in recent contact with someone who tested positive for a contagious illness such as COVID or influenza). <u>Please use the dispensation and do not attend Mass.</u>
- 4. You care for the sick, homebound, or infirmed.
- 5. You are pregnant.
- 6. Those 65 years of age or older (per the CDC's recommendation of high-risk individuals).
- 7. You cannot attend Mass through no fault of your own (e.g., no Mass is offered, you are infirmed, or, while wanting to go, you are prevented for some reason you cannot control (e.g., your ride did not show up, the church was at capacity).
- 8. If you have *significant* fear or anxiety of becoming ill by being at Mass.

Now that the general dispensation from attending Mass has been lifted we will no longer be offering the Communion Service on Sundays.

- Daily Mass on Mondays, Tuesdays, and Wednesdays in the main church. On Monday evenings, the Rosary will be prayed at 5:30 pm and Mass will be celebrated at 6:00 pm. On Tuesday and Wednesday mornings, the Rosary will be prayed at 8:00 am and Mass will be celebrated at 8:30 am. Weekend Masses are on Saturday at 5 pm and Sunday at 9 am (livestream) and 11 am.

St. Joseph: spouse of the Virgin Mary, foster father of Jesus, and patron saint of the universal Church. In celebration of the 150th anniversary of Blessed Pope Pius IX's declaration of St. Joseph as Patron of the Universal Church, Pope Francis has

proclaimed a special "Year of St. Joseph." It is a wonderful opportunity to increase our love for St. Joseph and knowledge, "to encourage us to implore his intercession and to imitate his virtues and his zeal" (Patris Corde).



"Receiving one of the COVID-19 vaccines ought to be understood as an act of charity toward the other members of our community. In this way, being vaccinated safely against COVID-19 should be considered an act of love of our neighbor and part of our moral responsibility for the common good."

<u>United States Conference of Catholic Bishops</u>

NEW COVID-19 LITURGICAL PROTOCOLS:

- 1. Those who are fully vaccinated may wear a facecovering and social distance but are no longer required to do so in churches.
- 2. Those who have not been fully vaccinated are to continue wearing face-coverings and to practice social distancing to protect themselves and others in churches. Because a parish community and our society requires mutual trust and a commitment to the common good, each individual is asked to make the best decisions for himself as well as for others. Parishes do not have the responsibility to verify who is and who is not vaccinated.
- 3. Each parish is to provide a portion of the church with a size to be determined by the pastor where social distancing and face-coverings are consistently maintained. This section is for anyone, vaccinated or unvaccinated.
- 4. All unvaccinated Catholics are encouraged to consult with their doctor about the vaccines. Resources to assist Catholics in understanding the moral use of COVID vaccines can be found at aod.org/vaccines.
- 5. The Sign of Peace may resume with the normal wording, "Offerte vobis pacem / Let us offer each other the sign of peace," allowing parishioners and families to make their own determinations about how widely to share some sign of peace.

COVID LITURGICAL PROTOCOLS WHICH REMAIN IN PLACE:

- 1. Parishes should continue to provide signage about current COVID protocols.
- 2. Parishes should keep doors open to ventilate churches as they are able.
- 3. Parishes are encouraged to continue the COVID arrangement of vessels for bread/wine on the altar.
- 4. Clergy and Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion should continue to wear masks while distributing Holy Communion.
- Parishes are encouraged to maintain sanitization stations at the locations of the distribution of Holy Communion.
- 6. Parishes are to continue to refrain from the distribution of the Chalice to the faithful (except for a Bride and Groom on their wedding day).


