A midrash explains that the tablets of the Law were to remind us that love comes in pairs as does religious leadership. The beginning of Pirkei Avot (chapters 1 and 2) teach of the importance of leadership by pairs. For the last 23 years, I have had the honor of sharing the religious leadership of Temple Israel with an honorable man; a man who served as my bimah partner and friend.

MY LAST ARTICLE

I did not always know I
wanted to be a Cantor.
After two wonderfully gratifying summers
during high school as a

Music Therapist's aide, I decided I wanted to be a Music Therapist, but relinquished that idea when I saw how scientifically rigorous the curriculum was (80% Science, 20% Music).

Then in grad school, I set my sights on a career in show business. (I had garnered some excellent reviews and LOVED the sound of applause.) But my childhood Cantor talked some sense into me:

"Broadway doesn't need you. The world of opera doesn't need you. Jewish Music needs you! Jewish Music is a dying field, and it needs young people like you to keep it alive and preserve it for future generations. Be a Cantor! As a Cantor, like a teacher, you never know where your influence ends. As a performer, your influence ends generally at the end of the performance. Be a Cantor, and you'll uplift and inspire people! As a performer, you'll be entertaining. Be a Cantor, and you'll be engaged in a mission that very few people are engaged in nowadays. Or you can audition for that role on Broadway, and one day find yourself in a line of

people that stretches twice around the block, all auditioning for the same role. They don't NEED you, son! Jewish music needs you; be a Cantor!"

So I took him up on it, and after 45 years, I have no regrets. I have been lucky enough to be steadily employed for 40 years in a profession where my ADHD and rudimentary social skills were not TOO much of an obstacle (list of additional personality flaws available on request from Linda:).

I have been able to use my voice in the service of God and the Jewish community. I have been privileged, over the past 40 years, to help about 2,000 boys and girls navigate through the rite of passage called bar/bat mitzvah. Although, I confess, I miss the sound of applause, nevertheless, the sound of hundreds of people – on the High Holidays, more than 1,000 people – singing the prayers along with me is every bit as gratifying, and something I shall sorely miss. Also being part of a family, sharing life's highs and lows, joy and sadness, has been a privilege.

Linda and I cherish all our friends here at Temple Israel, and we are pleased to report that we plan to stay in Charlotte for the foreseeable future. Though you won't be seeing me EVERY Shabbat, this congregation will remain our spiritual "home base." I hope you will all be able to join us at Temple Israel the weekend of June 15-17, so I can thank you all personally for these 23 years.

ENGAGEMENT

By Monty Bennett, Membership Director Recently, I have had a number of people comment to me that they want to develop a closer connection to their congregational

family at Temple Israel, but don't know how to get involved. We are a vibrant congregation today due to the involvement of our members over the past 120 years.

Here are some ways you can get involved or be more engaged with Temple Israel:

- Be present. Come to services. We have daily minyanim and dynamic Shabbat services that you can attend. We need your presence to make a minyan, in order to have a service. It's not only a time to pray, but to support those who need to say Kaddish.
- 2. **Be a greeter.** The best way to get to know your congregational family is to welcome others to services. Judaism is built on a foundation of hospitality and this is a great opportunity to meet many of our members that you might only know from seeing them across a room.
- 3. Invite people for a Shabbat dinner. Don't worry if you don't do Shabbat like your neighbors do. You can have pizza out on the deck or do a fancy, formal Shabbat dinner. Invite some friends and some people that you'd like get to know better. Maybe you'd like to gather with some young families at the park on a Sunday morning for a play date. The first step to getting to know people better is by extending your hand.
- 4. **Be aware.** Have you seen one of our senior members getting some items out of their car? Or seen a young family struggling to get a stroller out of their car while wrangling a couple of young children? Lend a hand to help them find their way into the synagogue and/or show them where the babysitting room is.

- 5. **Be friendly.** When you see a first time guest at kiddush, invite them to sit with you and tell them about Temple Israel. Tell them your TI story and invite them back for some other activities. Everyone appreciates a new friend.
- 6. Send a card. In every issue of Kol Yisrael, Birthdays and Anniversaries are listed. Consider sending a card to one/some of those people. Or, send a card to someone in the hospital. Connections are built and strengthened by little acts of kindness. It's a mitzvah!
- 7. **Attend a class or program.** Our educational and cultural programming is often planned based on what our congregants have requested. Take advantage of what we have to offer. The synagogue should be the focal point in a community for education and the arts.

In order for a congregation to thrive, its members must actively participate in it; membership is not a spectator sport. Your contributions will impact not only yourself, but future generations of our congregation as well.



TEMPLE ISRAEL SIMCHA TREE




