Extension work that is in the plan below - This is for children who might want to do more. Please don't feel under any pressure to do this..

Put the days of the week on a page up on a door or on a wall so that you child can look at it from time to time.

If you have an alphabet chart put it up too. Otherwise write out the alphabet - in lower case letters - for your child to refer to and hopefully write the letters the correct way every time he/she is writing. Always start letters at the top except for d and e.

Do the same with numbers 1 - 5 or 1 - 10 if you wish. It's very important that children form their numbers correctly – always start at the top.

- Look at the cover describe what you can see.
- Discuss what the word 'title' means.
- Point to the title and read the title. What/Who is on the cover?

Page 1

 Discuss each of the characters. See how much your child remembers about each character. Ask questions based on the information given on the attachment.

Read pages - Tues-P.2 & 3 / Wed-P.4 & 5 / Thurs-P.6 & 7 / Fri-P.8 & 9

- Then pick out random words to see if he/she can read them in isolation.
- Let your child ask you to find a word.


I put in English phonetics to help parents who may not have any Irish.



Winchilla travels around in her airchair. She has a dog called Burger who is a bull dog. She has a wand and can do magic. She gets her spells from her laptop.




Denzel live in a cave on the other side of the lake. He has a speed boat. He loves reading books, he has lots of them in his cave. He can fly using his wings.

Orin lives in a castle. He loves fixing things and inventing things. He always has his tool box with him.


G.G. is a giant. He lives in a tall tower. There is a garden on the roof top. G.G. loves to play the violin. He travels around Wandsville on his motorbike.
