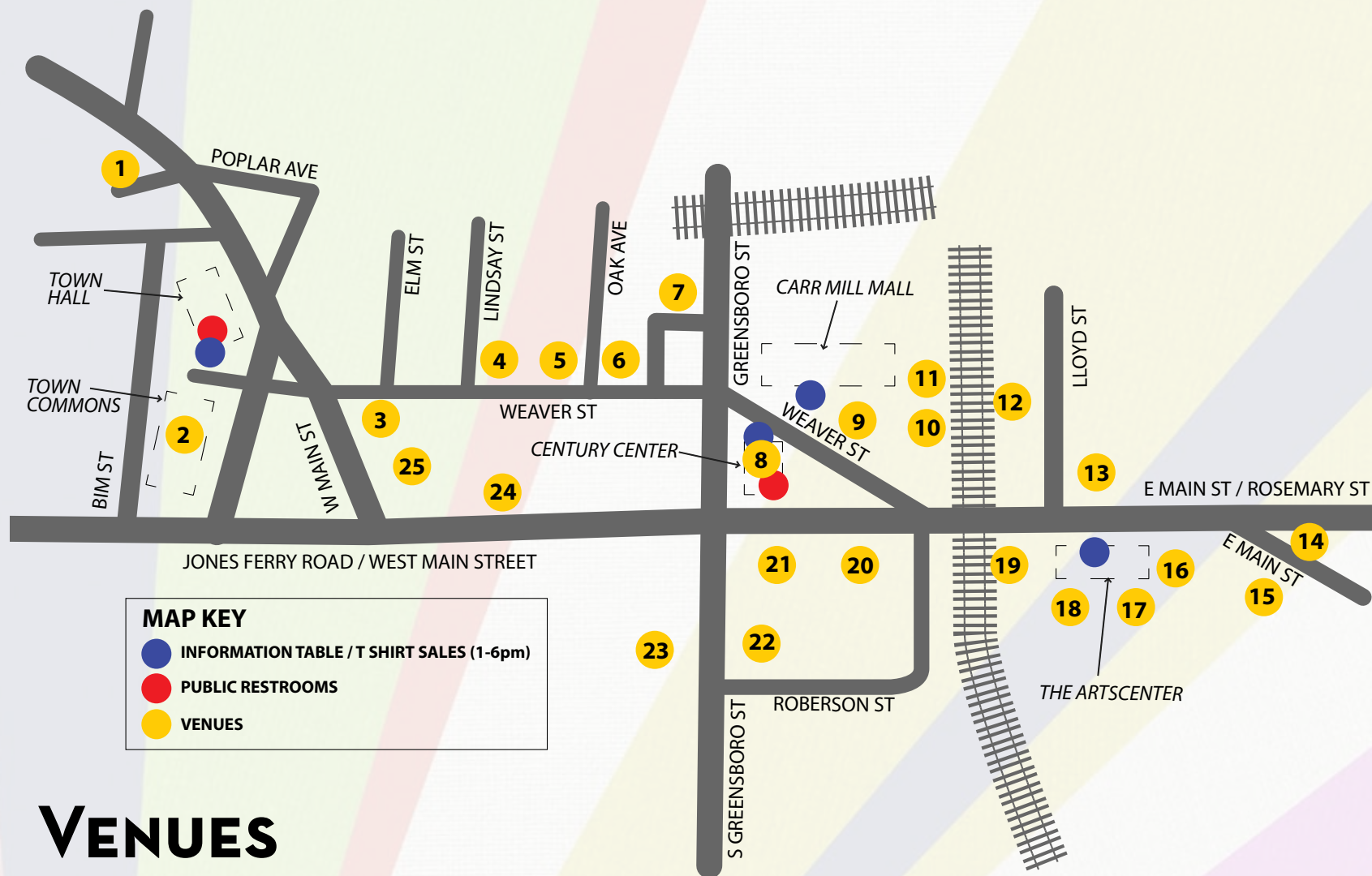

Twelve of the 25 festival venues are either indoors or can move indoors, so music at these venues will continue rain or shine. In the case of a possible day-long rain, the festival committee, police and public works staff will make a decision concerning the viability of the outdoor venues by 9:30 a.m. on the day of the event. Weather-related changes to the performance schedule will be announced on the Carrboro Recreation & Parks weather line, which can be reached by calling 918-7373.

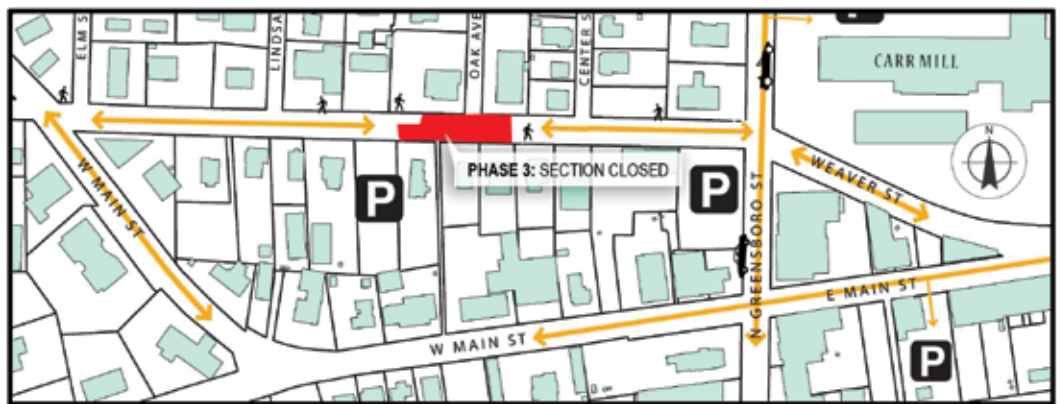
