## **Meeting Minutes**

#### LNQG Minutes - April 27, 2021

The meeting was called to order by our President Jill Daly-Huston and was held as a Zoom meeting beginning at 7:00 p.m.

There were 13 members present including a new member, Pat Bochey. Welcome Pat!

The members present had a general conversation about all of the facilities and organizations that our Guild currently donates to, and the list is as follows:

Lake Norman Regional Medical Center in Mooresville – They take baby and child quilts, and Colleen Thrailkill will be ready to collect what members have at our May meeting. She is also looking for panels to make simple lap quilts for senior citizen centers, roughly 44" X 50".

Habitat for Humanity – They are currently asking for quilts, but table runners are not needed. If anyone has made any they can still be donated however.

Patriotic Quilts – Cheryl Campbell was not able to attend the meeting, but she continuously accepts quilts with a patriotic theme.

Hospice House (new facility in Mooresville) - Sandy Palmer has been in charge of this charity, and quilts are being made to stay with the facility. When asked if residents or families requested to take a quilt home what should be done, it was thought that Sandy should be contacted to find out if this was okay. These quilts are to be twin size. Mary Jo Belk asked that if any table runners already made and not needed for Habitat could be made into placements instead. Since Sandy was not able to attend the meeting, Mary Jo will contact Sandy Palmer to find out as those present did not have any answer.

The May Guild meeting was discussed, and will be an in-person meeting at the church. The guidelines for mask-wearing are still in effect, as well as social distancing. The members present decided that these guidelines would be followed for this first meeting together regardless of any changes in the guidelines between now and then. The meeting room will be set up with this in mind. For any new members not familiar with our meeting place at Center Presbyterian Church in Mooresville, it is large enough to accommodate these needs.

Members are asked to bring their center block for the Round Robin to the meeting, as well as any donation quilts for the Guild charities. Any block of the month projects completed can be brought as well.

Annette Rogers announced programs for the upcoming months as follows:

May – A reminder that Pam Carter will be doing our program.

June – Linda Bryant will be discussing hexagon quilts.

July – Carol Harris will have a program/demo/workshop for coloring on fabric and overlaying with aloe for color-setting.

September – The Guild will host a sew-in at the church, Members present discussed making the sew-in an opportunity to work on charity quilts, and kits will be made up for interested members. Members may bring their own lunch, as well as sewing machines and any tools and supplies needed.

Sew days in general were discussed, and members agreed that these would be beneficial in encouraging people to come participate. They could possibly be held on Friday evenings as well as Saturdays to work with members' schedules. Annette will check with Julie at the church to coordinate and check on available dates.

Colleen mentioned that she, Barbara Skwara and Judy Whitehead have been getting together to put together kits for charity quilts.

Dolores is going to check to see if any rent will need to be paid for the remainder of this year for in-person meetings. According to the records, the deposit paid and one check written previously should cover the remaining months.

Annette brought up the previously uncompleted Secret Pal activity and if it should continue this year. The consensus of the members present was to restart it next year.

Kim Townsend asked if the fat quarter auction could be done again this year as it was a Guild favorite. Marian Voorhees was the auctioneer last time and volunteered to do it again. Thank you Marian! Some ideas were discussed for uses for the fat quarters from the last auction. They included using them for charity quilts, "seed money" for the next auction, or giveaways at the Welcome Table. No final decision was made during the meeting.

Kim and Tracey Galmon are going to have 3 quilt patterns for the Guild to choose from for the Quilt Show Donation Quilt at the meeting in May.

Marian mentioned she has been enjoying the Quilting Arts Podcast, and how it is a good resource for those missing the programs and workshops.

Dolores reported the current checkbook balance is \$6606.76.

The meeting was adjourned at approximately 8:15 p.m.


