## Fired Up to Support Students

When you're doing something that no one has done before, you're probably going to run into some surprises. Most of the surprises we've encountered with HIKI NŌ: The Nation's First Statewide Student News Network have been positive. For example, we anticipated that 20-22 schools from Hawaii's 170 middle and high schools would join the network in our very first season, which started last February. Wrong. There were 54 schools that signed up. During the current second season, the number grew quickly to 67 and counting.

A related surprise was the eagerness of educators across the state to make a leap of faith to teach multi-media, even though it wasn't something for which they'd trained. They simply knew that their students learn best when they can use technology to create and connect. "Standing in front of the class with a piece of chalk and a blackboard simply doesn't engage students like it did before," one longtime Social Studies teacher told us. She signed up to guide a HIKI NŌ ("Can Do") team in reporting about the school community because she wanted her students to have this valuable 21st-century experience. However, she lacked a background in both journalism and video production.

PBS Hawaii's core HIKI NŌ team — Executive Producer Robert Pennybacker, Managing Editor Susan Yim, and Online Editor/Assistant Producer Lawrence Pacheco — spend many hours mentoring teachers on an individual basis statewide, giving them feedback to inform the students' work.

Students from every populated Hawaiian island participate in HIKI NŌ, including students from the privately owned island of Niihau who attend the charter school Ke Kula Niihau O Kekaha. With all of the schools signing up, we needed to give more teachers more mentoring time than our initial budget could provide, especially on neighbor islands. So we've been asking community groups in every county to contribute funds to enable us to hold workshops, some in conjunction with the national award-winning Searider Productions out of Waianae.

Indeed, community groups are coming forward to support students on their islands. On Kauai, the S.W. Wilcox Trust, the G.N. Wilcox Trust and the Annie Sinclair Knudsen Memorial Fund have given PBS Hawaii \$30,000 to train the teachers who guide HIKI NŌ students. In Maui County, the Fred Baldwin Memorial Foundation, established in memory of a son who died too young at age 24, contributed \$7,500. And on Hawaii Island, KTA Super Stores' Barry Taniguchi



gave \$10,000 in honor of his grandparents, Koichi and Taniyo Taniguchi, who worked to make life better for the next generation.

“Our students’ outstanding contribution to HIKI NŌ has highlighted special and unique features of our island including the episode featuring students speaking in the Niihau Hawaiian dialect,” says Knudsen Fund adviser Darcie Yukimura of the Hawaii Community Foundation. “We are privileged to have been able to support our students’ participation in HIKI NŌ.”

Our workshops do more than dispense information and teach skills. They build peer relationships among teachers who work in the same district, but who’ve never met. Many times already, we’ve seen meaningful results from connections being forged. For example, Maui High’s Clint Gima finds time and tools for Hana K-12 School teacher Ramona Moeai, as she tirelessly works around a shortage of equipment and broadband connectivity issues. Dedicated to her students in an isolated community,



Ms. Moeai gamely makes that winding drive from Hana, over those fabled 54 bridges, to attend HIKI NŌ gatherings on Maui.

Other organizations are helping island kids get ahead in other ways. The Atherton Family Foundation provides a “lending library” of video equipment in each county to make sure that schools have access to basic technology they need to take part in HIKI NŌ. The Hilo Rotary

Club bought more video equipment to encourage and support the HIKI NŌ stories produced by tiny Connections New Century Public Charter School in Hilo.

All middle and high schools in the state are invited to be part of HIKI NŌ, and it costs them nothing to join. Likewise, there is no charge to receive mentoring or attend training workshops, all thanks to PBS Hawaii donors.

HIKI NŌ students translate their learning into real-world performance, contributing to a weekly noncommercial newscast at 7:30 pm Thursdays, presenting many hyper-local stories that you don’t find anywhere else in the media. Yes, PBS Hawaii encounters surprises in this ambitious “first of” project teaming education and media. But it’s no surprise that adults across the state are stepping forward to invest in the success of the next generation. It’s a tradition of our past that must be carried into the future.

We stand in admiration of educators and community funders for serving as “keepers of the flame,” stoking the fire of discovery and inspiring young people to shine.

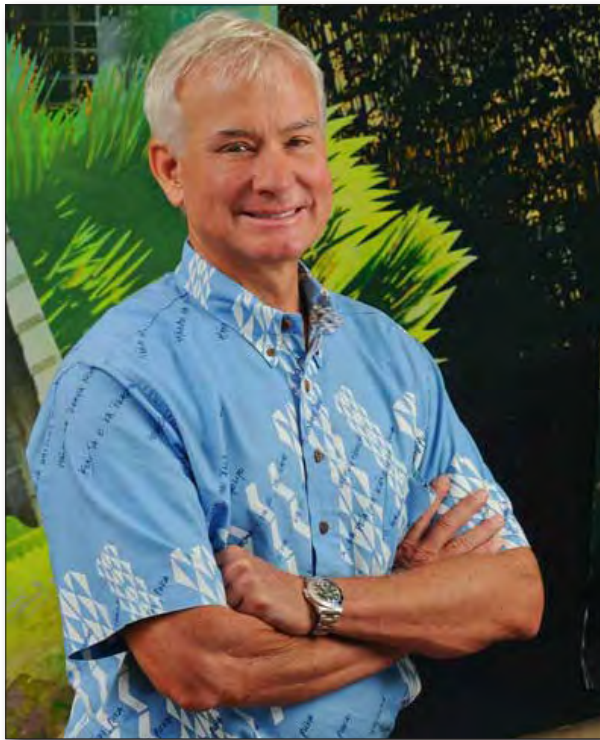

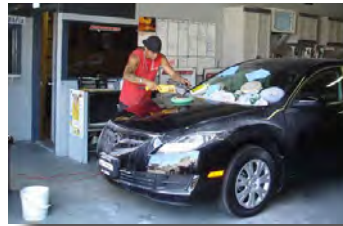

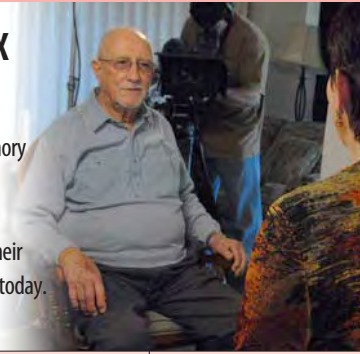
