An educational program has been designed to show students the value of forest products, the many ways that wood is sued in our everyday lives and for the forest management practices used by the forest industry.

FFA programs from area high school will participate in a forestry contest that will test their general knowledge about forestry terms, tree identification, log scale, soil land judging, compass practicum and will end with a lumberjack session.

CRITTER TENT - Both days, this hands on tent allows visitors to handle and gaze upon several nonvenomous, live amphibians and reptiles, and mammal skulls and furs. UK Entomology's insect and spider "petting zoo" featuring live tarantulas, scorpions, giant roaches, and other creatures. The critter tent will be an opportunity for people to get a close look at some very unusual creatures in a safe, educational environment.

SCHOLARSHIP FUNDS NOW **AVAILABLE**

he William H. Steele Memorial Scholarship Fund is now available to members who have someone in need of educational assistance. The Scholarship Committee has increased returns from the endowment set up from a wide range of membership donations over the years and is now set to make available three different \$1,000 scholarships that



will be paid out over two semesters. The funds will be available starting this fall and scholarships are also available for attending the lumber grading school in Memphis.

Applicants must be US citizens and high school graduates in good academic standing with a minimum 2.5 grade point average. Transcripts or institutional verification may be requested to document/verify academic standing. Recipients will be asked to demonstrate continued strong academic performance prior to receiving funds for the second semester.

Preference will be given to students demonstrating:

- Strong academic performance
- Interest in a career in forestry or the wood industry
- Experience working in the wood industry and with KFIA members
- Commitment to a career in forestry or wood industry through successful completion of forestry coursework



KENTUCKY DIVISION OF FORESTRY Nurseries and Seedling Orders

The Kentucky Division of Forestry operates two seedling nurseries for the purpose of planting on public and privately-owned land. These nurseries are located at Gilbertsville in Marshall County near the Kentucky Dam and at Grassy Creek in Morgan County near the town of West Liberty.



The nurseries offer different species of hardwoods and conifers for sale for planting on open crop or pasture land, developing a Christmas tree plantation, enhancing wildlife habitat, improving urban areas and reclaiming surface mining sites.

Approximately 2 million seedlings are grown each year beginning with planting seeds and maintaining seedling beds throughout the growing season. After one to two years of growth, the tree seedlings are then lifted from the seedling beds during the dormant season and packaged into bundles for sale. Seedlings are available to Kentucky landowners at a reasonable price and are shipped to individuals from January through April.

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
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
