



bedtime treat.




Electricity can be dangerous!

Play it safe with electricity!




Electrical Safety NO-NOs

Electrical NO-NOs can be very dangerous and you should NEVER make them angry. Always play it safe! Here are some things you should NEVER do.

- 1. NEVER stick your fingers or toys into an outlet.
- 2. NEVER handle plugs or switches when your hands are wet.
- 3. NEVER use a radio or hair dryer around a bath or shower.
- 4. NEVER pull a plug from an outlet by the cord.
- 5. NEVER use cords that are cracked or frayed.
- 6. NEVER fly a kite near a power line or in the rain.
- 7. NEVER climb a tree that is near a power line.
- 8. NEVER play outside during a thunderstorm.
- 9. NEVER use electrical appliances without adult supervision.
- 10. NEVER enter areas marked "DANGER" or "HIGH VOLTAGE."
