

## Chaplain's Corner

Well, we have come to the end of summer officially and the days are getting shorter and there is a definite nip in the air at night!

Our kindies have been in school for five weeks and looking like old hands at school - the year is quickly moving ahead.

Our children are a very precious commodity in our school community to be handled with care. At times we can inadvertently injure their spirit and they may become withdrawn and hurt.

We are all born with a spirit, soul and body and all three are interrelated. Our deepest relationships are built on the spirit level. The soul and the body are embedded within the spirit. The spirit is likened to the tentacles of a beautiful sea anemone. If an anemone is poked with a stick these soft flowing tentacles withdraw and close up till it becomes like a shell to protect itself from further injury.

This is similar to the spirit of a person, as the anemone is open and vulnerable so is the spirit of a child. But it can be wounded so easily. If the spirit closes, the soul and the body close to the same degree. A person with a closed spirit will usually avoid communication become quiet and withdrawn not responsive to affection, may become argumentative want to run away and show anti social behaviour.

Sarcasm, harsh words, unjust treatment, unkind jokes can lead to the closing of a person's spirit. When this happens to a child their spirit closes, affection is withdrawn, relationships are strained and they can become angry and unresponsive. These indications may be symptoms of a closed spirit.

To reopen a child's closed spirit it is important for the adult to recognize what is happening and acknowledge this to the offended child with tenderness and softness.

There are many non verbal ways to show the child he is valued and loved but it must be done slowly. Listen intently to what the child is telling you without judgement or justification, trying to understand where the problem lies.

It is so hard for parents/adults to admit they are wrong but for a meaningful relationship to result it is necessary, showing him/her that even adults can make mistakes. Touching the child lovingly will allow the offended child to reach out to the parent or whoever has offended him/her. If the child draws back look further for a person that may have offended the child.

Next newsletter I will continue with the beauty of forgiveness.

Dear Parents and Students in Stages 2 and 3,

Interested students in Stages 2 and 3 are invited to prepare a speech with a multicultural perspective. As for our regular public speaking competition, students will be judged on the matter, method and manner they employ when making their speeches. They must speak on one of several topics (see over).

Students in Stage 2 should speak for 3 minutes, and students in Stage 3 should speak for 4 minutes (as for the regular public speaking competition).

There will also be an impromptu component for the speech – 1 minute for Stage 2 and 2 minutes for Stage 3.

Students should show an understanding of multiculturalism. Their speech should demonstrate a balance between fact and opinion as well as a balance between humour and sincerity. They should be confident and engaging speakers.

Entry fees are \$20.00 per student.

The competition is not held until early August; however, the deadline for entries is 24<sup>th</sup> March.

For this reason, I am asking that students with an *interest* in this competition to let me know. They should then prepare a short speech of about 2 minutes (the entire speech is not required at this stage) about one of the topics listed overleaf as well as an outline of any other ideas to present to me by the 22<sup>nd</sup> March.

Schools are only permitted to enter 2 students per stage. If more than 2 students from each stage show an interest in this event, I will conduct an informal competition.


