Combat Search and Rescue and Special Operations is the mission of the 58th Special Operations Wing with five different rotary-, fixed-, and tilt-rotor aircraft types. Research & Development





Kirtland Economic Impact Statement

As the Air Force's fifth-largest installation, Team Kirtland's economic impact is significant, making up more than 10% of the local economy and accounts for 13% of local jobs.

Kirtland Workforce and Payroll

Kirtland's workforce includes DoD Active Duty, Civilian, Guard and Reserve, Department of Energy civilian employees and contractors, nonappropriated fund and public employees. Kirtland's more than 23,000 strong workforce is growing. All mission partners, to include Sandia National Laboratories, are projecting to add more than 2,000 jobs.
