News from the State Website

Bishop Libasci's vision to bring a new hope and the good news of Jesus Christ, through our Catholic faith, to

all in New Hampshire is being realized — wh — through the good works of the Diocesan Catholic Schools Office, who are committed to making Catholic education accessible, available, and affordable to any family that desires it. There are many ways in which the CSO is working to achieve this mission. In the last year, they have opened two new schools, expanded educational opportunities for students with non-typical learning abilities, and provided additional funding for financial aid through the establishment of the St. John Neumann Catholic School Trust.

By providing accessible, affordable, and available Catholic education in our state, we are preparing youth for the past they will inherit, a future they will shape, and an eternity with Christ. Children and teens today need a faith-filled education more than ever before; to know they were wonderfully made in the image and likeness of God, and deserving of a safe environment in which to learn.

We are pleased to share that the Catholic School Office has partnered with the Knights of Columbus in an effort to strengthen Catholic education all over New Hampshire. This partnership will focus on a renewed call to lift up our schools; as men and Knights in our Diocese. We hope this is the beginning of a wonderful relationship between our two ministries and we are thrilled to share our first mission with you.

Fr. Kyle Stanton, pastor of Good Shepherd and Holy Family Parishes, along with the Catholic School Office, is set to open a new parish school, Salve Regina Academy, this September. Initially hoping the school would have 35 students enrolled, the Prek-8 school located in Gorham, NH, already has 81 students pre-registered and are on a waitlist!

The motivation to establish this new school came from the parish and local community. For many years, parents and grandparents lamented at the closure of the Catholic schools of years past and have asked Fr. Stanton to open a school for their children. All of those voices reached his ears, heart, and faith, and he knew it was time for his voice to answer.

Work to open the school is still very much underway. Tuition for the first year will be set at \$4,000 per student, which is significantly lower than that of other Catholic schools in the state, due in large part to the economic challenges faced by many families in the North Country.

Although the school building is structurally sound and in great condition, we are seeking funds to help the school with very important life and safety upgrades. The school is requires security cameras, fire alarms, fire doors in each classroom, partial ADA upgrades and critical fire escape exits in classroom, with an expanded easement on one side of the building. We are asking that Councils consider a donation to reach our goal of \$20,000 to help fund these necessary upgrades. Your Council's donation not only supports Salve Regina

Academy, but serves as a commitment to Catholic education all over our state and fulfills our evangelistic calling.

As we launch this renewed commitment to educating and evangelizing young people, we plan to partner with the Catholic schools on a continual basis; by providing financial and spiritual assistance. We are aware of the good works many Councils already do for their local Catholic schools and for those we are profoundly grateful. Any support you can give to this new initiative in assisting schools all over our State is appreciated and welcomed. Penny A Knight Program

Vocations to the priesthood and religious life are very important to the Catholic Church and to our Order. We need priests to offer the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass and to teach and lead us on the path to Jesus. Education costs are extremely high for the candidates to the priesthood and religious life. The NH State Council wants to assist these men and women with a special calling by providing financial support for their education.

The Penny-A-Knight-A-Day (PKD) program was established by the NH State Council at the October 2009 Quarterly Meeting. This program is voluntary and provides needed dollars to the NH State Council Vocations fund. This fund is used to support religious vocations to qualified candidates throughout the State of NH.

On an annual basis, the PKD program asks each Brother Knight to add an additional \$3.65 (Penny-A- Knight-A-Day) to their annual council dues. The entire \$3.65 would be deposited into the NH State Council Vocations fund and used for priests and religious.

The process is as follows:

- Council Financial Secretary (FS) sends out the annual dues statements to the members.
 - An additional note is added to the statement (or separate insert) asking the member to add PKD \$3.65 (.01 per day X 365) to their annual dues for the NH State Council Vocations Fund
 - o NOTE: Keep in mind this is a voluntary program
- FS collects the additional \$3.65 and maintains separate documentation to track the PKD funds collected
- The FS cuts one voucher for all PKD donations from the Council to the Council Treasurer who in turn will write one check payable to the "NH State Council", annotating in the "Memo" line "Vocations Fund."

 FS mails the check to the State Secretary before the State Convention.
- The State Deputy will present a check representing the combined donations of all NH State Councils to the Bishop of Manchester at the State Convention.
- I want to emphasize again that this is a voluntary program. However, because of the shortage of priests and religious, it is imperative that we as Knights of Columbus do all we can to promote religious vocations throughout the world and especially in the State of New Hampshire. Please bring this proposal to the membership at your very next Council Business meeting.

The candidates for the priesthood and religious life will be most grateful to the Order for our donations to assist them in completing their theological studies.



In a letter dated April 28th, Fr. Kyle Stanton, pastor of Good Shepherd and Holy Family Parishes, announced to his parishioners that Salve Regina Academy will open for the 2019-2020 Academic year on the site of the Holy



Family

Parish Center.

This new parish school is built upon the vision of an "authentically Catholic community of lifelong learners dedicated to discovering all that is Good, True, and Beautiful through a commitment to academic excellence and personal discipleship in the holistic tradition of Catholic education". Two years ago, Fr. Stanton formed a committee to establish the location, curriculum, and culture of a new Catholic school. Parents wanted a curriculum, culture, and mission distinctly different from that of other schools.

For the September 2019 school year, there are currently has 81 students pre-registered for grades PreK-8, and the school is operating on a waitlist for the September 2019 school year.

Plans to finalize the opening of Salve Regina Academy are still very much underway. The Diocesan Catholic Schools Office is working closely with the school committee and will be aiding the school, in a variety of ways, throughout its inaugural year. The school requires security cameras, fire alarms, fire doors in each classroom, partial ADA upgrades and critical fire escape exits in classroom, with an expanded easement on one side of the building.

Catholic Education Support



Dear Friends at St. Kathryn's Parish:

Thank you for your very generous gift of \$6,000.00 to the food pantry for the "Feed Our Kids" Program. We deeply appreciate your help.

We are presently preparing for our annual "Back-Pack Sign -Up" for our families. We distribute them to all the children in our families in August. Your support helps us keep many programs operating.

Since January we have already provided over 59,643 meals to our families. We continue our "Feed Our Kids" week-end food program. The program provides 8 meals for children to use over the week-ends. Bags of food are delivered to the individual Hudson schools for anonymous distribution to children as they go home for the week-end. No names are taken, the counselors at the schools merely tell us how many bags they need and our high school students bring them to the schools. Since September, the beginning of the school year, up to the last week of school in June, we have provided 23,164 meals to our children. During the summer we will continue to provide bags of food through the Food Pantry and at the town Recreation Center on Wednesdays.
