Dear SACHI Members:

In October 2016, SACHI embarks on its 20th year, a cause for celebration! To its dedicated members, enthusiastic sponsors, and to its Bay Area institutional partners, SACHI owes deep appreciation for their sustained and encouraging support. A small organization like SACHI could not otherwise have evolved into a quality driven entity with a meaningful presence.

Its intimate character has enabled the organization to carve a creative space that brings thought provoking programs to public audiences. In experiencing these programs over the years, you may have seen that cutting edge SACHI events offer a unique lens for art and culture discussions. Dynamic and stimulating, they inspire and engage Bay Area audiences in refreshing new ways.

The year 2015-2016 represents another remarkable milestone in program offerings:

The year kicked off with two highlight Fall events. The first was a rare appearance by Mumbai-based artist Jitish Kallat. Discussing his art practices and the acclaimed curating project, the *Kochi Biennale, 2014*, the program, *A Conversation with Contemporary Artist Jitish Kallat* was an illuminating encounter. It brought together Dr. Karin Oen, Assistant Curator of Contemporary Art at the Asian Art Museum in a dynamic conversation with Jitish Kallat.

The SACHI Annual Event followed on the heels of the Jitish Kallat visit. Rama and Company Come to the Asian provided a splendid introduction to the major Ramayana themed exhibition, The Rama Epic: Hero, Heroine, Ally, Foe which opens to the public Oct. 21, 2016. Dr. Forrest McGill, Wattis Senior Curator of South and Southeast Asian Art, Asian Art Museum, and Chief Curator of the Special Exhibition, The Rama Epic presented an overview, followed by an enlightening conversation with renowned UC Berkeley Ramayana scholars, Dr. Robert Goldman and Dr. Sally Sutherland Goldman and Dr. Forrest McGill.

Celebrated theater and dance artist, Dr. Mallika Sarabhai performed an outstanding concluding piece from her stage production *Sita's Daughters* to an enthusiastic audience.

In conjunction with the above mentioned exhibition it was SACHI's great privilege to provide sponsorship support towards *The Rama Epic* publication, a 266 page companion volume, extensively researched by Ramayana scholars, and beautifully illustrated. The publication has just been released and is available for purchase in the Museum bookstore.

SACHI also provided co-sponsorhips for two Bay Area stage productions: *Dance Like a Man*, by Bay Area Drama Company specializing in South Asian theater; and towards *Shiva, A Memorial Tribute to Pandit Chitresh Das*, a multimedia Kathak performance staged by Chitresh Das Dance Company.

A stimulating Conversation and book discussion led by Kamini Ramini honored Bay Area contemporary dance artist turned fitness guru, Yasmen Mehta. Her entrepreneurial and adventurous spirit is captured in her autobiography, *Mom, You're Not Normal*

The two Spring events, Poets of Partition, and Behind the Man Who Knew Infinity: Panel Discussion with Film Excerpts were among SACHI's highlight events for the year. The Poets of Partition, a passionate talk rendered by Dr. Priya Satia, Professor of modern British and British Imperial History at Stanford University explored the experience and thoughts of Urdu poets who lived through the Partition of India in 1947- a rare portrayal of Partition with an artistic sensibility through the lens of the poets. Behind the Man Who Knew Infinity featured Film Director Matthew Brown, and a distinguished panel of mathematicians, Manjul Bhargava (Princeton Univ.), Ken Ono (Emory Univ.) and Kannan Soundrarajan (Stanford Univ.) In a most dynamic panel conversation and cutting edge presentation, the four presenters discussed the extraordinary genius of Indian mathematician, Ramanujan through an introduction and film excerpts. A 400-count public audience felt unbelievably touched and inspired by the event on Stanford campus.

An unusual creative event featured posture specialist Esther Gokhale in a Posture and Wellness Gallery Workshop, *Healing Through Art*, exploring Hindu and Buddhist artworks in the Asian Art Museum collection. Setting a meditative and peaceful tone, San Francisco architect Thomas Soper presented an enchanting illustrated talk on the architecture of Geoffrey Bawa in *A Portal to Sri Lankan Culture*.

Two recent summer events provided a closing note to the year's offerings. These comprised a trio of UK-based next generation artists in A Sarode, Sitar, and Tabla Recital with Arnab Chakrabarty (Sarode), Roopa Panesar (Sitar), and Sanju Sahai (Tabla) - an excellent Indian classical music performance, and an illuminating talk, Depicting the Beloved, on 16th century Persian painting, exploring the relationship between text and image, with visiting scholar, Naciem Nikkhah of Cambridge University. 16th and 17th century Mughal and Persian painting theme also surfaced in a SACHI led private tour of Asian Art Museum Spring Exhibition, Pearls on a String for SOAS alumni group.

From contemporary to classical visual arts discussions, music, dance, and theater performances, a healing through art workshop, a book discussion, invitation to Mughal time storytelling, Urdu poetry, a film discussion on the genius, Ramanujan, and an enchanting discussion on Sri Lankan architect Geoffrey Bawa, SACHI programs spanned a wide spectrum.

In addition, the opportunity to contribute towards *The Rama Epic* publication marks a very proud moment for SACHI and a significant highlight project for the organization.

We hope you found the calendar of events and activities to be enriching, and your association with SACHI fulfilling! Our warm appreciation to all members for your generosity in helping SACHI sustain the high quality programs. We thank you for your kind support and encourage members to renew memberships between October and December each year.

Please mark your calendar for the 2016 SACHI Annual Meeting and Event scheduled on November 5, 2016. Details of time, place and the agenda are attached. This year's distinguished speakers will be Prof. Diana Eck, Prof. of Religious Studies, Harvard Divinity School, and Prof. Rahul Mehrotra, Head of Urban Design and Planning, Harvard Graduate School of Design, discussing viewpoints from the 2013 Kumbh Mela research project initiated by Harvard University.
