## From the Principal

Welcome to Week 6.

Last week I had the privilege of observing Stage 2 students being deeply engaged with outdoor learning, making connections to real-life maths and enjoying their maths tasks. Nothing makes me prouder than to see students consolidating new knowledge by collaborating, communicating and being creative and critical thinkers. This skill set is exactly what we mean when we talk about 'future focused learners'. Our students need skills that they can transfer and adapt to any workforce they go into. Our teachers are working hard to ensure that every child has engaging curriculum that inspires learning with innovative practices. I am pleased to say our school was actually rated higher than expected in our External Validation panel interview last week. We are strongly working in the 'sustaining and growing' domain of the School Excellence Framework. I am so pleased to say that our school is positioned well to be starting our next three year School Planning cycle.


# The simp√est woy
