

ALCTO Vision, for the Future and for Today

Ascension has been blessed by the decision to make top-notch video and audio systems part of our "Mission: Possible Sanctuary Refurbishment" a few years ago. It gave us the ability to adjust virtually overnight to doing livestream services when the COVID lockdown struck last year. We are so grateful.

Now, as we look forward to the day when we can move out of the season of quarantine, we believe our hybrid live-and-online situation is bound to continue. In a wonderful addition, we have developed a group of people who worship with us all over the country and even the world. So we are planning to move forward with a new vision for how we can worship both in-person and online, and are putting the word out in case anyone who is grateful for this new ministry would consider donating to this new vision. Our current equipment is beginning to show signs of wear. We would like to give our tech team new cameras with better focus and zoom capability. It is amazing how the technology has improved on these types of cameras in just 3 years.

These new cameras would give us the ability to place them in more unobtrusive locations in the sanctuary without impeding people in the pews, where -- we hope – the majority of us can be back again before long. These 5 new cameras plus additional support equipment will cost about \$25,000.



Highlights from our second trimester wonder "How do heroes emerge out of conflict, and how can I be the change?

TK-2nd grades:

From the Desk of Mr. Ash February 16, 2021

"Mardi Gras is French for Fat Tuesday. It's also called Shrove Tuesday, Carnival Tuesday or Pancake Tuesday, depending on where the celebration is taking place.

No matter the name, it's a day of revelry that includes parades, parties and gastronomic indulgence before the Christian fasting season of Lent [which] begins on Ash Wednesday."



For many Christians, this is tomorrow, Feb. 17.

"The word Lent comes from the Old English word lencten, meaning spring. In the Western church, Lent begins on Ash Wednesday, six and a half weeks before Easter, and ends on Holy Saturday. In the Eastern church, Lent begins on the Monday of the seventh week before Easter and ends on the Friday before Palm Sunday." Fasting and prayer are done in remembrance and reflection of Jesus Christ's fasting in the wilderness.

Lent lasts 40 days. Sundays are not counted. The observance of Lent dates back to the 4th century." From CNN Travel (2-21-20) and Lent Fast Facts (2-15-21)
