

Our Freedom to Vote

Dear Friends,

With the High Holy Days almost upon us, it is a time to reflect on the past year and look to the year ahead. This is a special time for Wendy, Ben and me, as we are particularly excited to have been welcomed so warmly into the Temple Isaiah family. We thank everyone who has reached out to us so far, and look forward to meeting many more of you throughout the High Holy Days and during the school year.

One message we hear at the upcoming services is that at this time of year, our destinies are determined. On Rosh Hashanah it is written, and on Yom Kippur it is sealed, who will live and who will die, and what will become of us in the year ahead.

To be honest, this is not a statement that many of us believe literally. We may not think that our destiny is pre-determined. But the message still is significant. We realize that there are times in our lives that do determine what happens to us. Even the liturgy we read states that our actions can help alter the outcome of what is to be.

As we approach these Days of Awe, let us realize the awesome nature of our ability to affect our own lives and the lives of those around us. This can happen in many ways, and is different for each of us. Yet one privilege we all share is exercising our freedom to vote.

Rabbi Joel Mosbacher of Temple Shaarey Tefila in New York City recently wrote the following: "In our traditional morning blessings which we call *Nisim B'Chol Yom*, "Daily Miracles," we offer gratitude for being free. As American Jews, we do not take for granted the tremendous gift that we have in being free and enjoying the freedoms that every

American has. This is a freedom that Jews have not always been afforded. What a gift we have to be Jews living in America today, with the right to express our opinions and raise our voices through voting."

In this spirit, I want to encourage our exercising such a right and privilege here at Temple Isaiah. Here are some easy steps to follow:

- Register to vote: Check to see if you are registered to vote and if you are not, register online today. The registration deadline to vote in the state/local primary already passed, but the deadline for the general election is October 12th.
- Mark your calendars to vote: New York/local primary election on Thursday, September 13th, General election on Tuesday, November 6th.
- Pledge to vote: Fill out a pledge card, either online or in person at the synagogue, and let us know that you are committed to exercising your right to vote.
- Make a plan to vote: Finding your polling place by visiting nyc.pollsitelocator.com or vote.org
- Our Social Action Committee is helping to coordinate these efforts. Please contact Iris Schiff, idschiff@optonline. net, for more information.

Praise to You, Adonai our God, who has made us free, and gifted us with the privilege of voting. May we all make good use of this precious gift, this year and in years to come.

Wendy, Ben and I send best wishes for a Shanah Tovah U-m'tuka, a good and sweet year; one of joy, health and freedom.

Farewell to Wonder Woman

It was a difficult summer for many of us at Temple Isaiah. The weather was not great- many rainy weekends- and the few sunny days were marked by high temperatures and equally high humidity. The big bright spot was the arrival of our new rabbi, Rabbi Paul Sidlofsky, who has truly brightened up the season with his warmth, wit and comforting presence. We unfortunately needed that presence quite a bit since the congregation experienced many deaths of beloved members over the summer months. Additionally, I personally experienced losses of two people close to me in the month August.

One of the ladies who passed was my dear, dear friend Annie Bleiberg. Some of you might have met her. She and her daughter attended my installation last October. Annie was a Holocaust survivor, and although each survivor is and was unique with a special story that is both inspirational and horrifying, Annie's life and story stood out even amongst this illustrious crowd.

Annie was born in Poland and lived a joyous life attending a prestigious high school, rare for a Jew and even rarer for a girl. She spoke 7 language including Hebrew, and her parents were early Zionists. Annie's family eventually were sent to the ghetto and then placed on a train headed for Belzic, an extermination camp. Prepared for the worst, her father smuggled tools onto the train. He unscrewed the window and helped a teen boy up to jump. The boy was too afraid, so Annie took his place. The last thing she felt was her mother's two hands pushing her bottom up through the window. Her father jumped too, but her mother and sister never did and perished on arrival in the camp.

Jumping from a moving train was only the beginning of Annie's journey. She and her father were hidden by righteous gentiles, Annie posed as a Polish girl and was squealed on by a classmate, put in a ghetto prison and eventually sent to Auschwitz.

This was one of many Annie stories of friendship, cooperation and survival that she has shared with thousands of children and adults over the years. Annie never spoke about her experiences during the Holocaust for many years. After her husband passed away, Annie found her voice. She began speaking here and there and eventually became a docent with the Holocaust Museum and Tolerance Center in Glen Cove. Annie spoke with passion and conviction and her messages were always the same. "Learn well. Education is so important. It is what saved me". Truly, Annie's ability at languages made her very useful to the guards.

Her most surprising message was, "I was lucky". Yes, after the horrors and the torture, Annie felt she was blessed with much. She was grateful to the many individuals who helped her and for the loving family she raised and who supported her now. Annie believed in the goodness inside of people, she saw both sides of human nature up close, but chose deliberately to focus on the good. This is a lesson I will never forget from Annie.

I miss Annie so very much now. The holidays will not be the same without my Shanah Tovah phone call to Annie. Yet, I have her many lessons and years of friendship to give me comfort. I shall be forever grateful that she was my mentor, teacher, and friend.




Back to School

Tikkun Olam

The goal of Temple Isaiah's Social Action Committee is to provide opportunities for meaningful deeds of *Tikkun Olam*. On Sunday afternoon, August 19th, our "Down Memory Lane" event brought lots of smiles and joy to people suffering with varying of degrees of dementia and their caretakers. Congregants who are not regulars on the Social Action Committee came out to help, and our social hall was filled with good will and happy hearts! We'll be organizing similar events in the future, so please let us know if you would like to help with the planning or if you have ideas about how to reach even more people who would benefit.

As is our tradition, we will start our Jewish New Year with the mitzvah of giving food to those in need. This year we will donate to the Island Harvest Food Bank who will distribute the food for us. We'll be giving out bags at the end of the Rosh Hashanah services and asking that you to return them the following week on Yom Kippur. This year please look for the Island Harvest bins in the parking lot, and deposit your bags there. Island Harvest will pick up our food the day after Yom Kippur.

As we work together to perform the mandate of *Tikkun Olam*, voter engagement is essential! Our committee will work towards registering people to vote and to providing transportation to people who need a ride to their polling places. As Jews and American citizens, we have an obligation to participate in elections to ensure that policies at the local, state and national levels bring us closer to achieving our vision of a world where all people experience justice and compassion.

The Social Action Committee will be working towards encouraging and increasing voter turnout. Please check weekly announcements for information about:

- A Voter Registration Drive
- Questions and answers commonly asked in regard to registration or voting (voting as an absentee or from college, how to update registration if you've moved, etc.)

Please let us know if you're able to offer a ride to a polling place if someone's unable to get there. We're in the process of forming a cadre of volunteers.

Research shows that people are more likely to vote if they have publicly pledged to do so. To that end we will be distributing voter pledge postcards. The blessing on the card reads as follows:"

Praise to You, Adonai, our God, Sovereign of the Universe, who has made us to be free.






